## **Overview of Travel and Objectives**

Federal, Provincial and Territorial (FPT) Ministers responsible for internal trade met in Toronto to publicly announce the new Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA) – it will replace the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT). Minister Responsible for Trade, Jeremy Harrison, used the opportunity to reaffirm Saskatchewan’s strong support for open and non-discriminatory movement of goods, services, investment and people in Canada.
