Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

March 2017

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering March 12th to 18th, 2017, there were 561,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 2,400 from February 2017 but 2,000 more than the number employed in March 2016.

Agricultural employment was 35,800 persons in March 2017, down 900 from the February 2017 level and 4,400 less than the March 2016 agricultural employment level of 40,200. Non-agricultural employment was 525,400 persons in March 2017. This is a decrease of 1,500 from the February 2017 non-agriculture employment level of 526,900 but 6,400 more than March 2016.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for March 2017 was 6.7 percent. This is an increase of 0.2 percentage points from the February 2017 rate of 6.5 percent but 0.2 percentage points lower than the March 2016 level of 6.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 900 to 601,600 persons in March 2017 from 602,500 persons in February 2017. This is 900 more than the March 2016 labour force of 600,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> fell 0.2 percentage points to 68.8 percent in March 2017 from 69.0 percent in February 2017. The March 2016 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.3 percent.

There were 40,500 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during March 2017. This is an increase of 1,600 from February 2017 but is 1,100 less than the number unemployed in March 2016.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 570,400 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in March 2017, down 5,100 from the February 2017 level of 575,500 but is up 2,200 from the March 2016 employment level of 568,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March 2017 was 6.0 percent. This remained unchanged from the February 2017 rate of 6.0 percent and 0.2 percentage points lower than the March 2016 rate of 6.2 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 25,500 persons in March 2017 to 18,018,300 persons from 17,992,800 persons in February 2017. In March 2016, there were 17,726,600 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.2 percentage points in March 2017 to 7.2 percent from the February 2017 level of 7.0 percent. In March 2016, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.7 percent in March 2017. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than February 2017 but 0.4 percentage points lower than the March 2016 level of 7.1 percent.
