Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

June 2015

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering June 14th to 20th, 2015, there were 589,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is an increase of 6,400 from May 2015 and 7,500 more than the number employed in June 2014.

Agricultural employment was 40,400 persons in June 2015, down 2,500 from the May 2015 level and 4,800 less than the June 2014 agricultural employment level of 45,200. Non-agricultural employment was 548,700 persons in June 2015. This is an increase of 8,900 from the May 2015 non-agriculture employment level of 539,800 and 12,300 more than June 2014.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for June 2015 was 4.2 percent. This is a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from the May 2015 rate of 5.3 percent but 0.9 percentage points higher than the June 2014 level of 3.3 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 400 to 614,900 persons in June 2015 from 615,300 persons in May 2015. This is 13,700 more than the June 2014 labour force of 601,200 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.1 percentage points to 71.4 percent in June 2015 from 71.5 percent in May 2015. The June 2014 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.6 percent.

There were 25,800 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during June 2015. This is a decrease of 6,800 from May 2015 but is 6,200 more than the number unemployed in June 2014.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 576,100 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in June 2015, up 700 from the May 2015 level of 575,400 and up 7,100 from the June 2014 employment level of 569,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>seasonally adjusted</u> <u>unemployment rate</u> for June 2015 was 4.7 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the May 2015 rate of 4.9 percent and 0.9 percentage points higher than the June 2014 rate of 3.8 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 204,100 persons in June 2015 to 18,314,600 persons from 18,110,500 persons in May 2015. In June 2014, there were 18,141,900 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> decreased 0.6 percentage points in June 2015 to 6.5 percent from the May 2015 level of 7.1 percent. In June 2014, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.7 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 6.8 percent in June 2015. This is the same as in May 2015 but 0.2 percentage points lower than the June 2014 level of 7.0 percent.
