Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

July 2014

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the corrected Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week ending July 19th, 2014, there were 572,800 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 4,100 from June 2014 but 8,700 more than the number employed in July 2013.

Agricultural employment was 46,800 persons in July 2014, up 1,500 from the June 2014 level and 3,400 more than the July 2013 agricultural employment level of 43,400. Non-agricultural employment was 526,000 persons in July 2014. This is a decrease of 5,600 from the June 2014 non-agriculture employment level of 531,600 but 5,300 more than July 2013.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for July 2014 was 3.6 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the June 2014 rate of 3.3 percent but 0.9 percentage points lower than the July 2013 level of 4.5 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 2,500 to 593,900 persons in July 2014 from 596,400 persons in June 2014. This is 3,400 more than the July 2013 labour force of 590,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.4 percentage points to 70.4 percent in July 2014 from 70.8 percent in June 2014. The July 2013 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.4 percent.

There were 21,100 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during July 2014. This is an increase of 1,600 from June 2014 but is 5,400 less than the number unemployed in July 2013.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 566,500 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in July 2014, up 2,500 from the June 2014 level of 564,000 and is up 8,200 from the July 2013 employment level of 558,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for July 2014 was 3.2 percent. This is a decrease of 0.7 percentage points from the June 2014 rate of 3.9 percent and 0.8 percentage points lower than the July 2013 rate of 4.0 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> decreased by 5,700 persons in July 2014 to 18,157,400 persons from 18,215,100 persons in June 2014. In July 2013, there were 18,002,700 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.6 percentage points in July 2014 to 7.3 percent from the June 2014 level of 6.7 percent. In July 2013, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.4 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 7.0 percent in July 2014. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than June 2014 and 0.2 percentage points lower than the July 2013 level of 7.2 percent.
