Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

May 2013

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended May 18, 2013, there were 560,900 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during May 2013, an increase of 12,400 from April 2013 and 14,600 more than the number employed in May 2012.

Agricultural employment was 45,200 persons in May 2013, up 5,200 from the April 2013 level and 5,600 more than the May 2012 agricultural employment level of 39,600. Non-agricultural employment was 515,700 persons in May 2013. This is an increase of 7,200 from the April 2013 non-agriculture employment level of 508,500 and 9,000 more than May 2012.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for May 2013 was 4.4 percent. This is unchanged from both the April 2013 and May 2012 levels of 4.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 13,300 to 586,900 persons in May 2013 from 573,600 persons in April 2013. This is 15,300 more than the May 2012 labour force of 571,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 1.5 percentage points to 71.3 percent in May 2013 from 69.8 percent in April 2013. The May 2012 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.7 percent.

There were 26,000 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during May 2013. This is an increase of 900 from April 2013 and is 700 more than the number unemployed in May 2012.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 552,000 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in May 2013, down 1,200 from the April 2013 level of 553,200 but up 15,500 from the May 2012 employment level of 536,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2013 was 4.5 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the April 2013 rate of 4.0 percent but 0.1 percentage points lower than the May 2012 rate of 4.6 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 431,900 persons in May 2013 to 17,922,000 persons from 17,490,100 persons in April 2013. In May 2012, there were 17,677,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> decreased 0.2 percentage points in May 2013 to 7.2 percent from the April 2013 level of 7.4 percent. In May 2012, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.4 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 7.1 percent in May 2013. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than April 2013 and 0.2 percentage points lower than the May 2012 level of 7.3 percent.
