

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

March 2012

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended March 17, 2012, there were 522,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan during March 2012, an increase of 200 from February 2012 and 5,200 more than the number employed in March 2011.

Agricultural employment was 33,900 persons in March 2012, up 1,500 from the February 2012 level but 5,500 less than the March 2011 agricultural employment level of 39,400. Non-agricultural employment was 488,100 persons in March 2012. This is a decrease of 1,300 from the February 2012 non-agriculture employment level of 489,400 and 10,700 more than March 2011.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for March 2012 was 5.1 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the February 2012 rate of 5.3 percent and 0.6 percentage points lower than the March 2011 level of 5.7 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 900 to 550,300 persons in March 2012 from 551,200 persons in February 2012. This is 2,400 more than the March 2011 labour force of 547,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 68.2 percent in March 2012 from 68.4 percent in February 2012. The March 2011 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.7 percent.

There were 28,300 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during March 2012. This is a decrease of 1,100 from February 2012 and is 2,800 less than the number unemployed in March 2011.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 529,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan in March 2012, up 300 from the February 2012 level of 529,400 and is up 5,300 from the March 2011 employment level of 524,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March 2012 was 4.8 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the February 2012 rate of 5.0 percent and 0.4 percentage points lower than the March 2011 rate of 5.2 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 84,100 persons in March 2012 to 17,148,200 persons from 17,064,100 persons in February 2012. In March 2011, there were 16,934,200 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate remained constant at 7.7 percentage points in March 2012 from the February 2012 level. In March 2011, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.2 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in March 2012. This is 0.2 percentage points lower than February 2012 and 0.4 percentage points lower than the March 2011 level of 7.6 percent.
