

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

May 2011

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended May 21, 2011, there were 535,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan during May 2011, an increase of 17,200 from April 2011 and 2,400 more than the number employed in May 2010.

Agricultural employment was 42,800 persons in May 2011, up 3,300 from the April 2011 level but 1,800 less than the May 2010 agricultural employment level of 44,600. Non-agricultural employment was 493,100 persons in May 2011. This is an increase of 13,900 from the April 2011 non-agriculture employment level of 479,200 and 4,200 more than May 2010.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for May 2011 was 4.9 percent. This is a decrease of 0.7 percentage points from the April 2011 rate of 5.6 percent and 0.1 percentage points lower than the May 2010 level of 5.0 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 14,300 to 563,700 persons in May 2011 from 549,400 persons in April 2011. This is 2,200 more than the May 2010 labour force of 561,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 1.7 percentage points to 70.6 percent in May 2011 from 68.9 percent in April 2011. The May 2010 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.1 percent.

There were 27,800 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during May 2011. This is a decrease of 2,900 from April 2011 and is 300 less than the number unemployed in May 2010.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 526,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan in May 2011, up 2,500 from the April 2011 level of 524,300 and is up 1,200 from the May 2010 employment level of 525,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2011 was 5.0 percent. This is unchanged from both the April 2011 and May 2010 rates.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 389,900 persons in May 2011 to 17,478,700 persons from 17,088,800 persons in April 2011. In May 2010, there were 17,161,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.4 percentage points to 7.5 percent from the April 2011 level of 7.9 percent. In May 2010, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.4 percent in May 2011. This is 0.2 percentage points lower than April 2011 and 0.7 percentage points lower than the May 2010 level of 8.1 percent.
