## Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

August 2008

#### **UNADJUSTED DATA**

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended August 16, 2008, there were 519,600 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2008, an increase of 4,700 from July 2008 and 15,100 more than the number employed in August 2007.

Agricultural employment was 44,200 persons in August 2008, down 100 from the July 2008 level and 2,700 less than the August 2007 agricultural employment level of 46,700. Non-agricultural employment was 475,400 persons in August 2008. This is an increase of 4,800 from the July 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 470,600 and 17,800 more than August 2007.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for August 2008 was 5.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.6 percentage points from the July 2008 rate of 4.8 percent but 0.1 percentage points lower than the August 2007 level of 5.5 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 8,700 to 549,400 persons in August 2008 from 540,700 persons in July 2008. This is 15,300 more than the August 2007 labour force of 534,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> rose 1.0 percentage points to 71.4 percent in August 2008 from 70.4 percent in July 2008. The August 2007 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.0 percent.

There were 29,800 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2008. This is an increase of 4,000 from July 2008 and is 200 more than the number unemployed in August 2007.

#### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 511,500 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in August 2008, up 6,100 from the July 2008 level of 505,400 and is up 14,800 from the August 2007 employment level of 496,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for August 2008 was 4.5 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the July 2008 rate of 4.4 percent but 0.3 percentage points lower than the August 2007 rate of 4.8 percent.

#### CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 26,000 persons in August 2008 to 17,391,900 persons from 17,417,900 persons in July 2008. In August 2007, there were 17,173,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.2 percentage points to 6.5 percent from the July 2008 level of 6.3 percent. In August 2007, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.4 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 6.1 percent in August 2008. This unchanged from July 2008 but 0.1 percentage points higher than the August 2007 level of 6.0 percent.
