

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between March 2016 and April 2016 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.2 percent and 0.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index increased from March 2016 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; furniture; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and children's clothing.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for travel tours; fresh vegetables; women's clothing; men's clothing; and fresh fruit.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between April 2015 and April 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.3 percent and 1.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2015 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; water; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and property taxes and other special charges.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline; natural gas; traveller accommodation; homeowners' replacement cost; and women's clothing.
