Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

May 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.3 percent between April 2016 and May 2016 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.3 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the May All-items Index increased from April 2016 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline; men's clothing; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; fresh fruit; and passenger vehicle insurance premiums.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for furniture; traveller accommodation; non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware; children's clothing; and travel tours.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.2 percent between May 2015 and May 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.2 percent and 1.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The May All-items Index increased from May 2015 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; homeowners home and mortgage insurance; water; property taxes and other special charges; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline; traveller accommodation; furniture; natural gas; and fresh or frozen beef.
