

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.5 percent between May 2016 and June 2016 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.5 percent and 0.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index increased from May 2016 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; furniture; fresh vegetables; and inter-city transportation.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for men's clothing; women's clothing; personal care supplies and equipment; non-alcoholic beverages; and travel tours.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between June 2015 and June 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.4 percent and 1.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2015 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; water; property taxes and other special charges; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for traveller accommodation; gasoline; furniture; homeowners' replacement cost; and natural gas.
