Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.4 percent between June 2016 and July 2016 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.5 percent and 0.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.1 percent between July 2015 and July 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.0 percent and 1.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index decreased from June 2016 primarily due to lower prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; fresh fruit; travellers accommodation; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for: electricity; furniture; men's clothing; travel tours; and non-alcoholic beverages.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2015 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; electricity; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; water; and inter-city transportation.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: gasoline; traveller accommodation; homeowners' replacement cost; natural gas; and fresh or frozen beef.
