

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

September 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.1 percent between August 2016 and September 2016 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index decreased from August 2016 primarily due to lower prices for: dairy products; cereal products (excluding baby food); paper, plastic and aluminium foil supplies; household cleaning products; and inter-city transportation.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for: women's clothing; footwear; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; tuition fees; and gasoline.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.1 percent between September 2015 and September 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed 1.1 percent during the same period.

The September All-items Index increased from September 2015 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; electricity; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and water.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: gasoline; traveller accommodation; homeowners' replacement cost; natural gas; and fresh or frozen beef.
