Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

November 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.8 percent between October 2016 and November 2016 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.7 during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index decreased from October 2016 primarily due to lower prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; fresh or frozen beef; women's clothing; and bakery products.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for: non-alcoholic beverages; fresh vegetables; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; dairy products; and fresh fruit.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index remained unchanged between November 2015 and November 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index remained unchanged but the Saskatoon Consumer Price Index climbed 0.2 percent, during the same period.

The November All-items Index, despite not changing, experienced increased prices for: purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles; electricity; furniture; water; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were totally offset by lower prices for: gasoline; fresh or frozen beef; natural gas; homeowners' replacement cost and women's clothing.
