

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

February 2014

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 1.1 percent between January 2014 and February 2014 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.8 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 1.0 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the February All-items Index increased from January 2014 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles, travel tours and fresh fruit. Prices also rose for women's clothing, footwear and men's clothing.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for furniture, personal care supplies and equipment, fresh or frozen chicken and household cleaning products. Prices also declined for beer purchased from stores, other food preparations and processed meat.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.3 percent between February 2013 and February 2014 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.3 percent and 2.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The February All-items Index increased from February 2013 primarily due to higher prices for purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles, cigarettes, homeowners' replacement cost and electricity. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, passenger vehicles insurance premiums and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for seeds, plants and cut flowers, prescribed medicines, telephone services and clothing accessories, watches and jewellery. Prices also fell for non-alcoholic beverages, passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs and non-electrical kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware.
