

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

September 2013

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According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.6 percent between August 2013 and September 2013 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Indexes both rose 0.6 percent, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index increased from August 2013 primarily due to higher prices for purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, children's clothing (including infants) and women's clothing. Prices also rose for tuition fees, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles and natural gas.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for travellers accommodation, gasoline, travel tours and inter-city transportation. Prices also fell for homeowners' maintenance and repairs, dairy products and other food preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.5 percent between September 2012 and September 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.8 percent and 1.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The September All-items Index increased from September 2012 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, food purchased from restaurants, cigarettes and passenger vehicle insurance premiums. Prices also rose for electricity, rent and fresh vegetables.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, travel tours and home entertainment equipment, parts and services. Prices also fell for seeds, plants and cut flowers, prescribed medicines and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles).
