

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

November 2013

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.3 percent between October 2013 and November 2013 while the Canada All-items Index was unchanged. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.2 percent and 0.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the November All-items Index decreased from October 2013 primarily due to lower prices for gasoline, traveller's accommodation and inter-city transport. Prices also fell for women's clothing, non-alcoholic beverages, telephone services and fresh or frozen chicken.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for fresh vegetables, fresh fruit and bakery products. Prices also rose for homeowners' replacement cost, men's clothing, internet access services and subscriptions to online content providers (excluding online newspapers and periodicals) and mortgage interest cost.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between November 2012 and November 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 0.9 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.7 percent and 1.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The November All-items Index increased from November 2012 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for cigarettes, electricity, rent and homeowners' replacement cost.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and clothing, accessories, watches and jewellery. Prices also fell for seeds, plants and cut flowers, home entertainment equipment, parts and services, prescribed medicines and furniture.
