

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

January 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.4 percent between December 2011 and January 2012 while the Canada All-items Index also advanced 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.4 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the January All-items Index increased from December 2011 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, men's and women's clothing and water. Prices also rose for inter-city transportation, non-alcoholic beverages and traveller accommodations.

Moderating these increases were decreased prices for travel tours, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also declined for prescribed medicines, non-prescribed medicines, cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television) and processed meat.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.3 percent between January 2011 and January 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.5 percent and 2.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The January All-items Index increased from January 2011 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, homeowners' replacement cost, mortgage interest cost and rent. Prices also rose for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, telephone services and water.

These increases were partially offset by price decreases for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), home entertainment equipment, parts and services and the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles. Prices also declined for household textiles, prescribed medicines, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and cigarettes.
