

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.7 percent between February 2012 and March 2012 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.7 percent and 0.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2012 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, travel tours, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also rose for homeowners' replacement cost, women's clothing and rent.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for fresh vegetables, personal care supplies and equipment, men's clothing and non-alcoholic beverages. Prices also declined for fresh fruit, pet food and supplies and fats and oils.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.8 percent between March 2011 and March 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.9 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.0 percent and 1.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2011 primarily due to higher prices for homeowners' replacement cost, mortgage interest cost, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and rent. Prices also rose for gasoline, water and telephone services.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for fresh vegetables, home entertainment equipment, parts and services, women's clothing and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles. Prices also fell for children's clothing (including infants), recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and prescribed medicines.
