

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

August 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between July 2012 and August 2012 while the Canada All-items Index also advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the August All-items Index increased from July 2012 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, traveller accommodation and gasoline. Prices also rose for women's clothing, personal care supplies and equipment, household textiles and paper, plastic and foil supplies.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for fresh vegetables, processed meat, dairy products, fresh or frozen beef and fresh fruit. Prices also fell for children's clothing (including infants) and inter-city transportation.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.7 percent between August 2011 and August 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.0 percent and 1.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The August All-items Index increased from August 2011 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, passenger vehicle parts and maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for rent, homeowners' replacement cost and personal care supplies and equipment.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, women's clothing, natural gas and furniture. Prices also rose for prescribed medicines, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and inter-city transportation.
