

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

September 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between August 2012 and September 2012 while the Canada All-items Index also advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index increased from August 2012 primarily due to increased prices for gasoline, tuition fees, furniture and homeowners' maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for women's clothing, children's clothing (including infants) and child care and housekeeping services.

Moderating these increases were price decreases for traveller accommodations, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), home entertainment equipment, parts and services and mortgage interest cost. Prices also fell for fresh vegetables, non-alcoholic beverages and bakery products.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.2 percent between September 2011 and September 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.3 percent and 1.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The September All-items Index increased from September 2011 primarily due to higher prices for rent, gasoline, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television), homeowners' replacement cost and tuition fees.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for women's clothing, natural gas, home entertainment equipment, parts and services and fresh vegetables. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), inter-city transportation and prescribed medicines.
