

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

November 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between October 2012 and November 2012 while the Canada All-items Index also declined 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.2 percent as well.

In Saskatchewan, the November All-items Index decreased from October 2011 primarily due to lower prices for gasoline, traveller accommodations, bakery products and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Lower prices were also observed for children's clothing (including infants), women's clothing and personal care supplies and equipment.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and passenger vehicles parts, maintenance and repairs. Higher prices were also recorded for coffee and tea, fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, food purchased from restaurants and dairy products.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.9 percent between November 2011 and November 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 0.8 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.1 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The November All-items Index increased from November 2011 primarily due to higher prices for rent, homeowners' replacement cost, homeowners' maintenance and repairs and property taxes (including special charges). Higher prices were also observed for passenger vehicles insurance premiums, cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television) and tuition fees.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, women's clothing and natural gas. Lower prices were also seen for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), prescribed medicines and fresh vegetables.
