

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2011

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index was unchanged between September 2011 and October 2011 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index was unchanged while the Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index was unchanged from September 2011, but prices increased for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, footwear, spectator entertainment (excluding cablevision and satellite services) and non-alcoholic beverages. Prices also increased for mortgage interest cost, property taxes (including special charges) and rent.

Offsetting these increases were lower prices for gasoline, inter-city transportation and traveller accommodation. Prices also fell for fresh vegetables, women's clothing, household appliances and homeowners' maintenance and repairs.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.8 percent between October 2010 and October 2011 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.9 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.0 percent and 2.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2010 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, homeowners' replacement cost, mortgage interest cost and rent. Prices also rose for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, food purchased from restaurants and telephone services.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for natural gas, furniture, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and home entertainment equipment, parts and services. Prices were also lower for women's clothing, men's clothing and household textiles.
