

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between February 2010 and March 2010 while the Canada All-items Index remained unchanged. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.2 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2010 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, women's clothing, and sugar and confectionery. Prices also rose for personal care supplies and equipment, non-alcoholic beverages, dairy products, and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, traveller accommodation, and prescribed medicine. Prices also fell for cereal products (excluding infant food), bakery products, household textiles, and travel tours.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.1 percent between March 2009 and March 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.3 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2009 primarily due to price increases for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, and electricity. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, rent, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, and the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by price decreases for natural gas, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, and property taxes (including special charges). Prices also fell for furniture, fresh vegetables, inter-city transportation, and home entertainment, equipment, parts, and services.
