

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

May 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between April 2010 and May 2010 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.2 percent and 0.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the May All-items Index increased from April 2010 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, traveller accommodations, housing replacement cost and telephone services. Prices also rose for fresh or frozen beef, dairy products and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

Moderating these increases were price decreases for fresh vegetables, non-alcoholic beverages, sugar and confectionery and cigarettes. Prices also fell for women's clothing, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles).

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between May 2009 and May 2010 while the Canada All-items Index also increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.5 percent and 1.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The May All-items Index increased from May 2009 primarily due to increased prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, electricity, rent and water. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants and cigarettes.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, property taxes (including special charges) and natural gas. Prices also fell fresh vegetables, bakery products, fresh fruit and home entertainment equipment – parts and services.
