

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index was unchanged between May 2010 and June 2010 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.1 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index was unchanged while the Saskatoon Index fell 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index was unchanged from May 2010 due to offsetting prices. Prices rose for food purchased from restaurants, cereal products (excluding infant food), fresh fruit and sugar and confectionery. Prices also increased for housing replacement cost, mortgage interest cost and inter-city transportation.

Offsetting these increases were lower prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles and non-prescribed medicines. Prices also fell for men's clothing, children's clothing (including infants) and footwear.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.3 percent between June 2009 and June 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.5 percent and 0.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2009 primarily due to higher prices for rent, housing replacement cost, cigarettes and health care services. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, water and the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, property taxes (including special charges) and natural gas. Prices also fell for prescribed medicines, bakery products and fresh vegetables.
