

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

November 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between October 2010 and November 2010 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Indexes both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the November All-items Index increased from October 2010 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle parts – maintenance and repairs and housing replacement costs. Prices also rose for fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, food purchased from restaurants and alcoholic beverages served in licensed establishments.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for natural gas, gasoline, traveller accommodations and cereal products (excluding infant food). Prices also fell for women's clothing, men's clothing and home entertainment equipment – parts and services.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.0 percent between November 2009 and November 2010 while the Canada All-items Index also increased 2.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.0 percent and 1.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The November All-items Index increased from November 2009 primarily due to increased prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, rent, electricity, housing replacement cost and property taxes (including special charges). Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants and cigarettes.

These increases were partially offset by price reductions for prescribed medicines, natural gas, cereal products (excluding infant food) and household appliances. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), home entertainment equipment – parts and services and passenger vehicles insurance premiums.
