

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

January 2009

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.1 percent between December 2008 and January 2009 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index were both unchanged during the same period

In Saskatchewan, the January All-items Index decreased from December 2008 primarily due to lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, travel tours, inter-city transportation and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also fell for personal care supplies and equipment, fresh fruit and other food preparations.

Moderating these decreases were increased prices for gasoline, women's and men's clothing and mortgage interest cost. Prices also rose for water, non-alcoholic beverages and traveller accommodations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.4 percent between January 2008 and January 2009 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.9 percent and 2.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The January All-items Index increased from January 2008 primarily due to higher prices for mortgage interest cost, housing replacement cost, rent and natural gas. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, bakery products and fresh vegetables.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, the purchase and leasing of recreational vehicles and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also declined for household appliances, home entertainment equipment – parts and services and fuel oil and other fuels.
