

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2009

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between February 2009 and March 2009 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.2 percent while the Saskatoon All-items Index was unchanged during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2009 primarily due to higher prices for sugar and confectionery, dairy products, preserved fruit and fruit preservations and processed meats. Prices also rose for inter-city transportation, traveller accommodations and gasoline.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, housing replacement cost, personal care supplies and equipment and men's clothing. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), travel tours and fuel oil and other fuels.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.8 percent between March 2008 and March 2009 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.6 percent and 1.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2008 primarily due to higher prices for mortgage interest cost, natural gas, rent and property taxes (including special charges). Prices also increased for food purchased from restaurants, dairy products and fresh vegetables.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles and fuel oil and other fuels. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles, home entertainment equipment – parts and services and housing replacement cost.
