

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2009

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 1.0 percent between May 2009 and June 2009 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 1.0 percent and 0.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index increased from May 2009 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, electricity, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, and prescribed medicines. Prices also rose for personal care supplies and equipment, food purchased from restaurants, and inter-city transportation.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for men's clothing, replacement cost (new housing), home entertainment equipment, parts and service, and processed meat. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), fresh vegetables, and other household supplies.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.0 percent between June 2008 and June 2009 while the Canada All-items Index increased 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.8 percent and 0.7 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2008 primarily due to increased prices for mortgage interest cost, food purchased from restaurants, electricity, and rent. Prices also rose for homeowners' maintenance and repair, property taxes (including special charges), and prescribed medicines.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, replacement cost (new housing), and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also fell for natural gas, fuel oil and other fuels, and home entertainment equipment, parts and service.
