

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2009

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between June 2009 and July 2009 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.3 percent and 0.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index decreased from June 2009 primarily due to lower prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, fresh vegetables, and inter-city transportation. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), children's clothing (including infants), and cereal products (excluding infant food).

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for women's clothing, prescribed medicines, fresh fruit, and men's clothing. Prices also rose for personal care supplies and equipment, traveller accommodation, and cablevision and satellite services (including pay television).

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.9 percent between July 2008 and July 2009 while the Canada All-items Index decreased 0.9 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.5 percent and 0.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2008 primarily due to increased prices for mortgage interest cost, food purchased from restaurants, electricity, and rent. Prices also rose for prescribed medicines, homeowners' maintenance and repairs, and property taxes (including special charges).

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, housing (replacement cost), and for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also fell for natural gas, fuel oil and other fuels, and home entertainment equipment, parts and services.
