

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.8 percent between March 2008 and April 2008 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.8 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.7 percent and 0.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index increased from March 2008 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, housing (replacement) cost, mortgage interest cost and cablevision and satellite services (including pay television). Prices also rose for furniture, inter-city transportation and other owned accommodation expenses.

Moderating these increases were price decreases for women's clothing, passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repair, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also fell for fresh or frozen chicken, personal care supplies and equipment and fresh vegetables.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.2 percent between April 2007 and April 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.6 percent and 4.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2007 primarily due to higher prices for housing (replacement) cost, gasoline, mortgage insurance cost and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance. Prices also rose for other owned accommodation expenses, food purchased from restaurants and rent.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, natural gas and fresh fruit. Prices also decreased for fresh vegetables, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and women's clothing.
