

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.1 percent between June 2008 and July 2008 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.1 percent and fell 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index decreased from June 2008 primarily due to lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, housing (replacement cost), and gasoline. Prices also fell for footwear, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), and household textiles.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for women's clothing and homeowners' maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, men's clothing, processed meat, and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.2 percent between July 2007 and July 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 3.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.4 percent and 3.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2007 primarily due to higher costs for gasoline, housing (replacement cost), and homeowners' maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for rent and food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, natural gas, and the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), footwear, fresh fruit, and home entertainment equipment parts and services.
