

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.9 percent between March 2017 and April 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 1.0 during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index increased from March 2017 primarily due to gasoline, food purchased from restaurants, telephone services, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles).

Moderating these increases were travel tours, men's clothing, children's clothing, other fresh or frozen poultry; and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between April 2016 and April 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.6 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.4 percent and 1.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2016 primarily due to gasoline, food purchased from restaurants, electricity, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and travel tours.

These increases were partially offset by telephone services, traveller accommodation, men's clothing, other food preparations and cereal products (excluding baby food).
