### Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index remained unchanged between June 2017 and July 2017 while the Canada All-items Index also remained unchanged. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price both fell 0.1 percent during the same period.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.8 percent between July 2016 and July 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.8 percent and 1.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index remained unchanged from June 2017. Despite remaining unchanged, prices increased for: telephone services; gasoline; inter-city transportation; men's clothing; and cigarettes.

The Saskatchewan, July All-items Index increased from July 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; cigarettes; water; purchasing and leasing of passenger vehicles; and electricity.

These increases were offset by lower prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; travel tours; dairy products; non-alcoholic beverages; and pet food and supplies.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; dairy products; traveller accommodation, men's clothing; and other food preparations.
