### Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.4 percent between September 2017 and October 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.0 percent between October 2016 and October 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.2 percent and 2.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index increased from September 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; telephone services; property taxes and other special charges; men's clothing and inter-city transportation.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; and property taxes and other special charges.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: travel tours; fresh vegetables; gasoline; women's clothing and traveller accommodation.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; traveller accommodation; furniture; men's clothing and natural gas.
