## Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

February 2018

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between January 2018 and February 2018 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.6 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.4 percent during the same period.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.9 percent between February 2017 and February 2018 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed 2.6 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the February All-items Index increased from January 2018 primarily due to higher prices for: travel tours; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; internet access services; non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware; and women's clothing.

The February All-items Index increased from February 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; food purchased from restaurants; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: telephone services; gasoline; fresh or frozen chicken; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); personal care supplies and equipment.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; traveller accommodation; homeowners' replacement cost; fresh or frozen chicken; and dairy products.
