CHAPTER 185

An Act to prevent the Employment of Female Labour in Certain Capacities

Short Title

1 This Act may be cited as *The Female Employment Act*.

Special license

2 No person shall employ a white woman or girl in any capacity requiring her to reside or lodge in or to work in any restaurant or laundry, without obtaining a special license for the purpose from the municipality in which such restaurant or laundry is situated, which license the council of every municipality is hereby authorised to grant.

Penalty

3 Any employer guilty of any violation of this Act shall upon summary conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two months.
