CHAPTER 170

An Act respecting Stock Injured by Railway Trains

Short title

1 This Act may be cited as *The Stock Railway Accidents Act*.

Notice to agent

2 In the event of any stock being killed or injured by any railway train the conductor or other person in charge of such train shall forthwith notify the nearest station agent of the railroad company upon whose line of railway the accident has occurred and the said agent shall forthwith in case the owner is known or afterwards becomes known to the agent send a notice to the owner stating the date and place of the accident.

Notice posted

3 The agent shall in all, cases forthwith post in a public place in the station house a notice giving a full description of every animal so killed or injured with a statement of the time when and place where it was so killed or injured and such notice shall not be removed for three months unless in the meanwhile the owner becomes known to the agent.

Penalty

4 Any person infringing any of the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty of not more than \$50.
