



## NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

### CROWN RESERVATION NO. 973

#### *The Crown Minerals Act*

Whereas:

- a) The Ministry of the Economy plans to begin the process of implementing the Mineral Administration Registry Saskatchewan (MARS) system on December 1, 2012
- b) The Minister must enter all legacy mineral dispositions, including pending applications, into the registry before the MARS system can be activated for public use;
- c) Persons applying for new mineral claims under *The Mineral Disposition Regulations, 1986* must submit their applications to the recorder or an official of the department within 30 days of the completion date inscribed on the No. 1 post; and
- d) In order to ensure that all legacy mineral dispositions, including new applications, are recorded in the MARS system, the Minister must withdraw from disposition, effective November 1, 2012, all Crown minerals that will be subject to the MARS system;

Notice is therefore given that pursuant to subsection (1) of Section 21 of *The Crown Minerals Act*, effective 12:00 AM CST on November 1, 2012 the following Crown minerals are withdrawn from disposition until further notice:

All Crown minerals within the Province of Saskatchewan other than any Crown minerals that are subject to:

- (a) The Helium and Associated Gases Regulations, 1964;
- (b) The Coal Disposition Regulations, 1988;
- (c) The Quarrying Regulations, 1957;
- (d) The Subsurface Mineral Regulations, 1960;
- (e) The Oil Shale Regulations, 1964;
- (f) The Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulations, 1969; or
- (g) The Alkali Mining Regulations.
