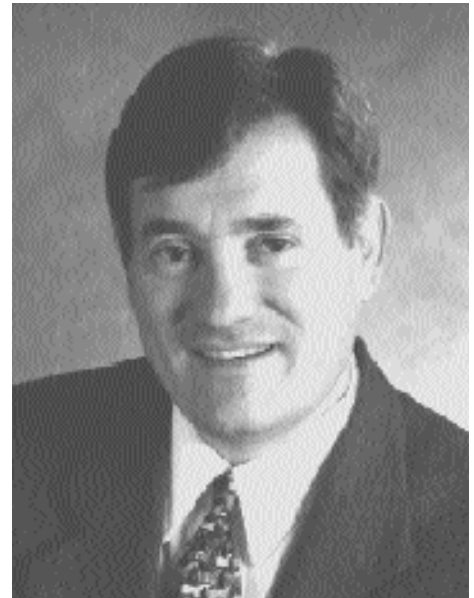
Foreword

Saskatchewan's economy is changing, providing new opportunities for prosperity and economic growth. The 2000 Economic Review shows strong growth in areas like mineral production, manufacturing and retail trade. Even in the farm sector, where producers of traditional commodities continue to face significant challenges, there is very positive news from those who are diversifying into areas like hog and poultry production.

Diversification has been, and will continue to be, a key factor in expanding our economy and creating jobs. As recently as 1988, a major drought struck the farm sector and sent our entire economy plummeting. Because of the diversification that has since taken place, however, the current difficulties in agriculture have not had the same effect on our economy. In fact, despite these difficulties, employment in Saskatchewan grew by nearly 5,000 last year.

Another very positive sign is Saskatchewan's improved economic position relative to other provinces. From 1992 to 1999, Saskatchewan posted the third highest average rate of growth in Canada at 3.4 per cent. In the same period, Saskatchewan registered the second highest average real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth per capita at 3.0 per cent. Our province had the very best increase in real productivity, with an average growth of 2.4 per cent during the period. All of this has had a positive effect on the disposable income of Saskatchewan residents, which grew, on average, 3.0 per cent a year between 1992 and 1999.

In March 2000, our Government introduced a major reform of Saskatchewan's personal tax structure that will encourage more growth and create more opportunities for Saskatchewan people. The first step in the plan was to bring Saskatchewan's sales tax base into line with most other provinces, allowing for significant reductions in personal income taxes. Concurrent with this change, a new Saskatchewan Sales Tax Credit was introduced to ensure tax fairness for lower income earners. On July 1, 2000 Saskatchewan's Flat Tax was reduced from 2 per cent to 1 per cent.



A new Personal Income Tax structure took effect January 1, 2001, with a move to a three-rate "tax-on-income" system, the elimination of all provincial surtaxes and a \$170 million income tax reduction for the 2001 tax year. By 2003, Saskatchewan residents will pay \$440 million less a year in provincial income taxes than in 1999 - making this the biggest tax cut in the history of the Province.

The Government of Saskatchewan remains firmly committed to sound financial management and a balanced approach to tax reduction, debt repayment and investment in key programs and services. Since 1994-95 we have reduced the Province's total debt by \$3.9 billion, brought our sales tax rate down from 9 per cent to 6 per cent and increased our investments in services like health, education and highways. In November 2000, we made a commitment to invest a further \$150 million to accelerate improvements to the province's roads and highways over the next three years. We will continue to carefully manage the finances of the province in a way that secures our important public services and produces long-term growth and opportunity for all Saskatchewan people.

Introduction

The economic indicators suggest that Saskatchewan's economy is responding positively to strong global demand and sharply higher oil prices. Production and drilling of both oil and natural gas have risen. Manufacturing shipments, international exports as well as retail trade and wholesale trade increased. Also, employment in the Province is higher. All of these suggest that Saskatchewan's economy will equal or exceed the projected growth rate of 2.4 per cent for 2000.

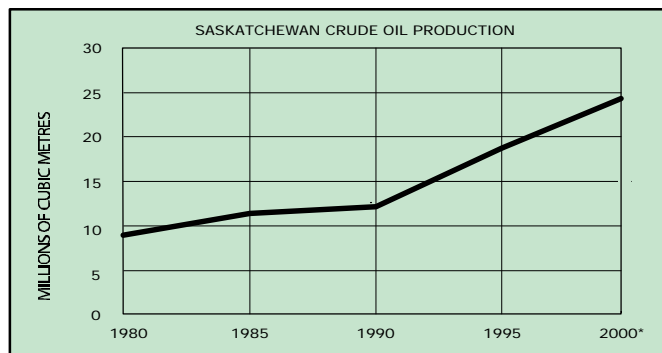
International Developments

The combination of strong global demand and rising world oil prices has significantly improved Saskatchewan's economy in 2000. Most countries have registered strong growth, including the United States and Canada. The WTI, West Texas Intermediate, oil price averaged \$29.70 U.S. per barrel in the first nine months, nearly three-quarters more than the average price for the same period last year.

International Trade

During the first nine months of 2000, imports increased 5.7 per cent. The increase in imports was more than offset by exports. Exports originating in Saskatchewan, including agriculture and fishing products, energy products and industrial goods increased 31.2 per cent over the same time period.

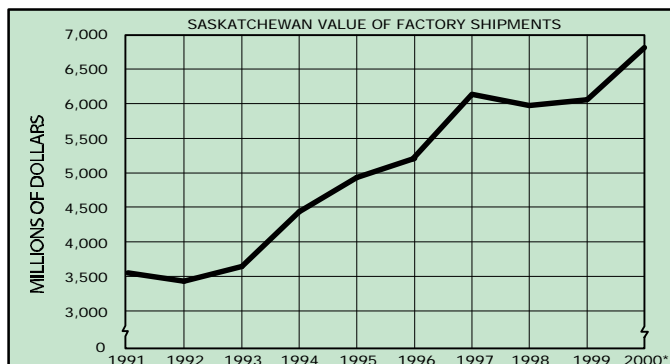
Mining

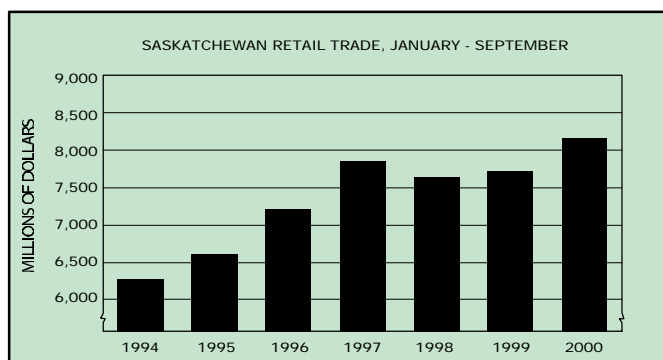
Mining is an important industry in Saskatchewan. Resources such as crude oil, natural gas and potash are mined in Saskatchewan. In the first eight months of 2000, crude oil production increased 13.8 per cent over the same period of 1999 while natural gas production saw a 2.2 per cent increase. Through September, the number of oil wells drilled increased 115.9 per cent and the number of gas wells drilled rose 19.3 per cent. During the same period, potash production increased 13.6 per cent.

Manufacturing Shipments and Retail Sales

A 16.9 per cent increase in the value of shipments of goods manufactured in Saskatchewan was realized in the first nine months of 2000 over the same period of 1999. Contributing to the increase was a 43.6 per cent increase in the value of shipments of the electrical and electronic products industrial group as well as a 25.7 per cent increase in the machinery industrial group. These increases translate into an increase in value-added activity in Saskatchewan providing more skilled employment opportunities.



Retail sales also increased an average of 6.1 per cent over the first nine months of 2000 compared to the same period of time in 1999. Over this same time period, wholesale trade increased 10.5 per cent.

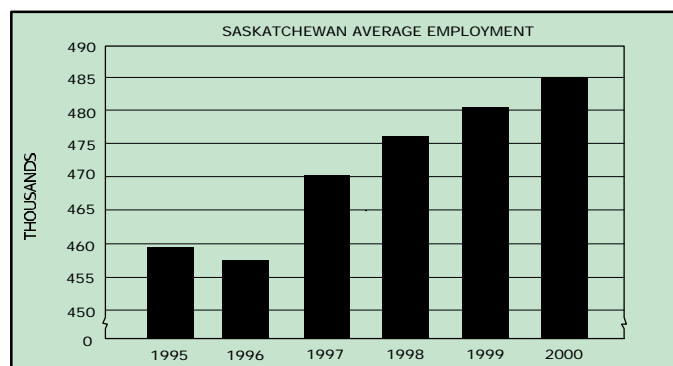
New motor vehicle sales also increased by 11.2 per cent in the first nine months of 2000.

Agriculture

Despite a decline in crop receipts, total farm cash receipts increased 3.6 per cent in the first six months of 2000 from \$2.9 billion in the first six months of 1999. Contributing to this increase was a 47.5 per cent increase in cash receipts received from hog marketings as well as a 23.3 per cent increase in poultry sales.

Employment and Population

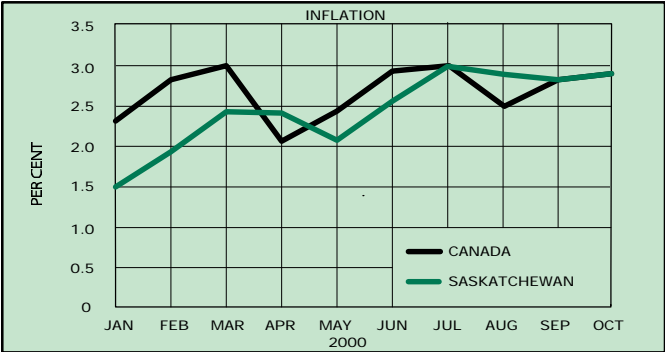
Saskatchewan's average unemployment decreased to 5.2 per cent in 2000 compared to 6.1 per cent in the same period last year. This result was driven by the approximately 4,958 new jobs created in Saskatchewan during the same period.



The employment increases occurred across many industries with health care and social assistance, transportation and warehousing and the forestry, fishing, and mining sectors leading the way. Employment growth took place despite a slight decrease in

Saskatchewan's population from 1,025,720 on July 1, 1999 to 1,023,636 on July 1, 2000.

Inflation



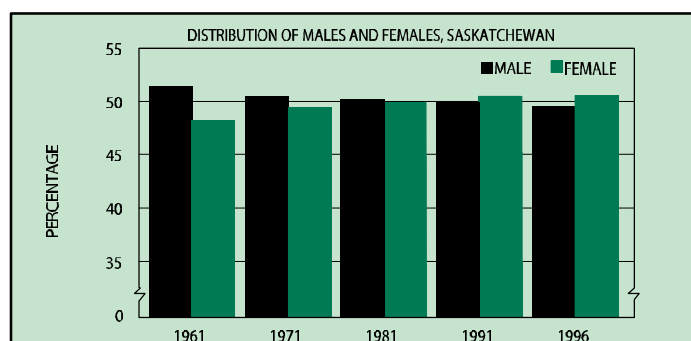
Inflation, as measured by the all-items Consumer Price Index in Saskatchewan, averaged 2.4 per cent in the first ten months of 2000. This is an increase from the 1.7 per cent inflation realized in the same period of 1999. The overall increase resulted from increases in the prices for such goods as shelter and transportation.

Similarly, Canada's average inflation rate increased 2.6 per cent over the first ten months of 2000. During the same period of 1999, average inflation was 1.6 per cent.

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Table 1: Population, Canada and Saskatchewan by Sex

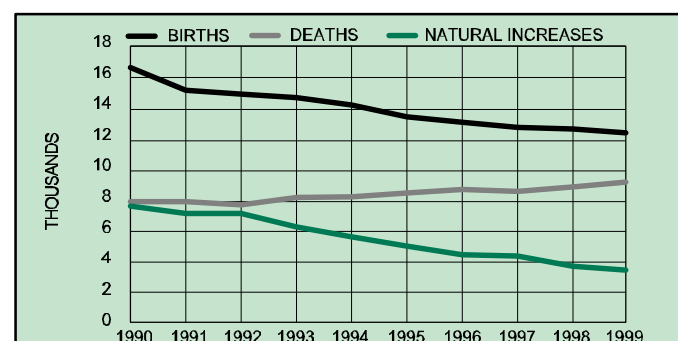

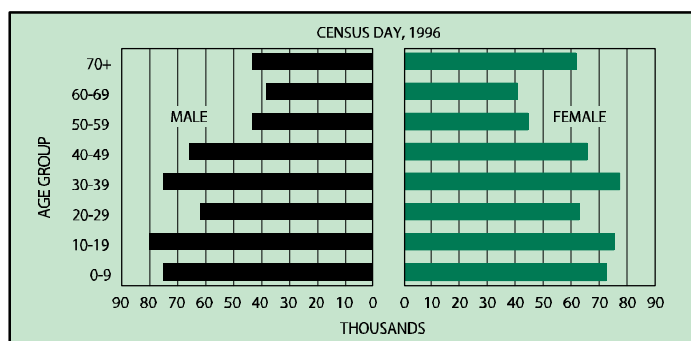

Table 3: Population, Saskatchewan Distribution by Age Groups



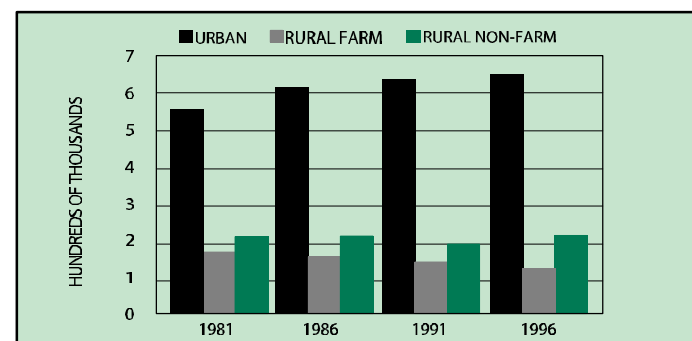

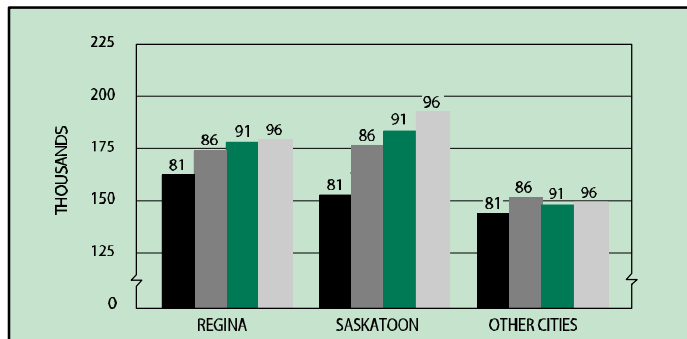
Table 4: Population, Saskatchewan Urban, Rural and Farm



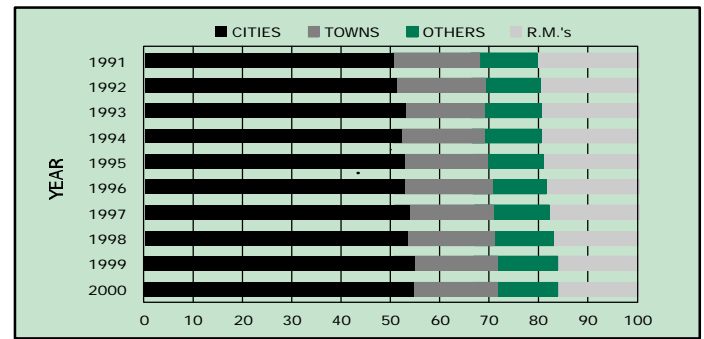

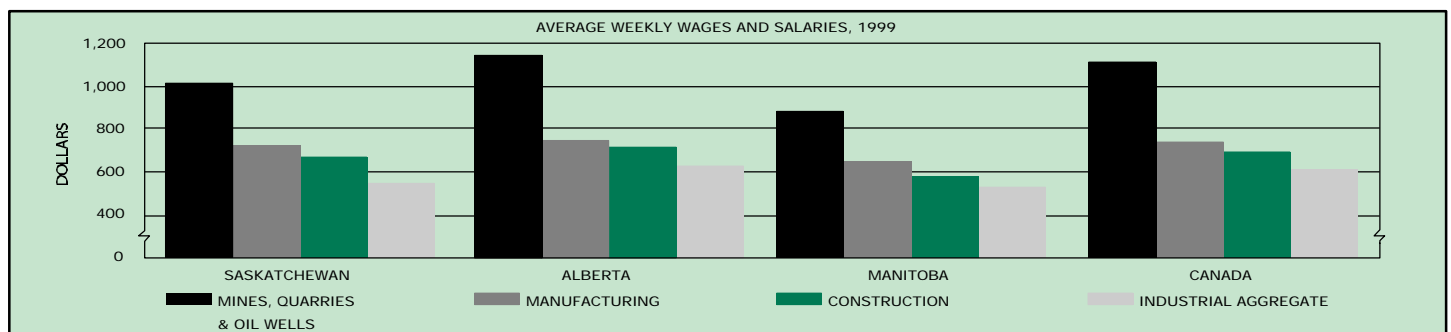

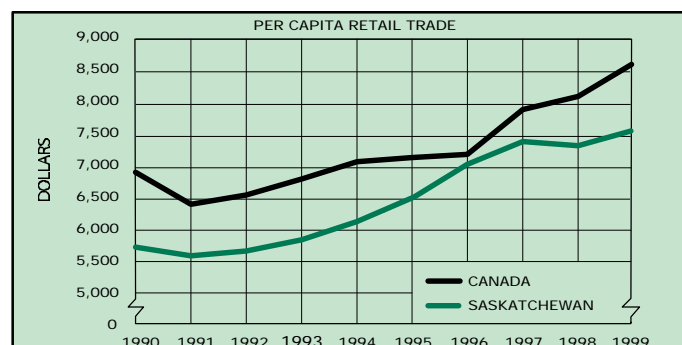

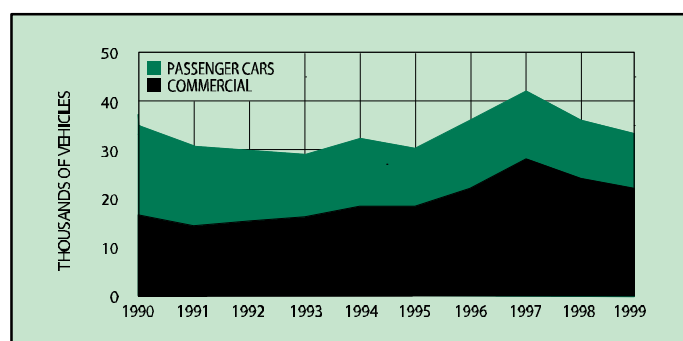

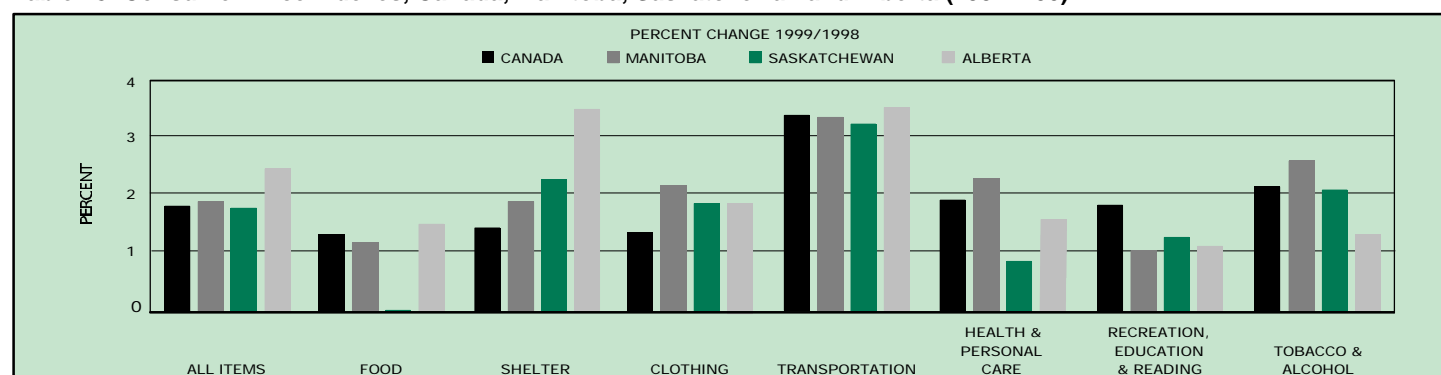

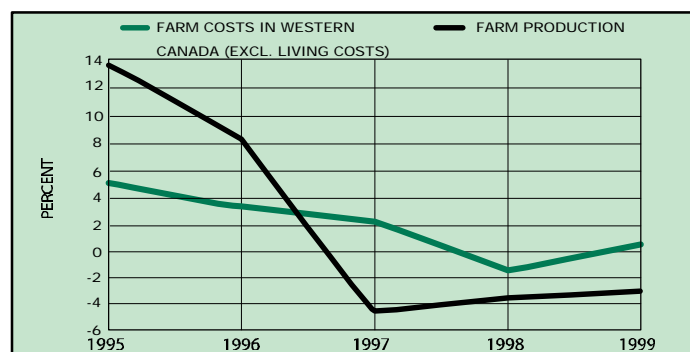

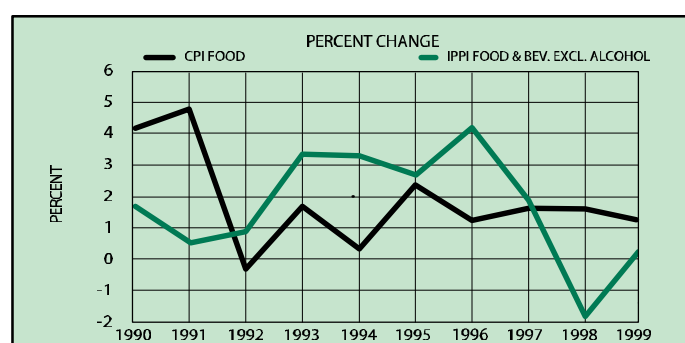

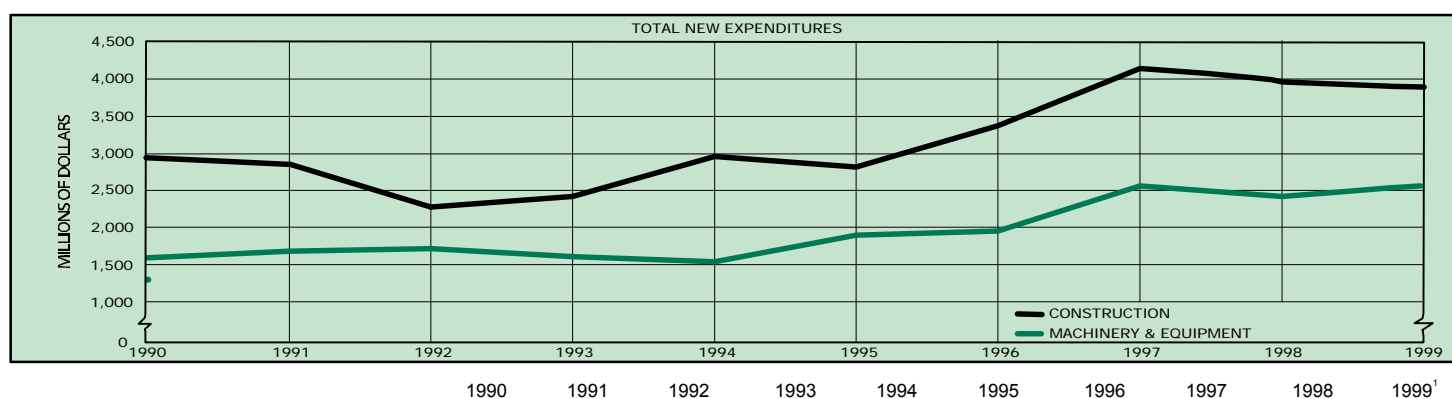

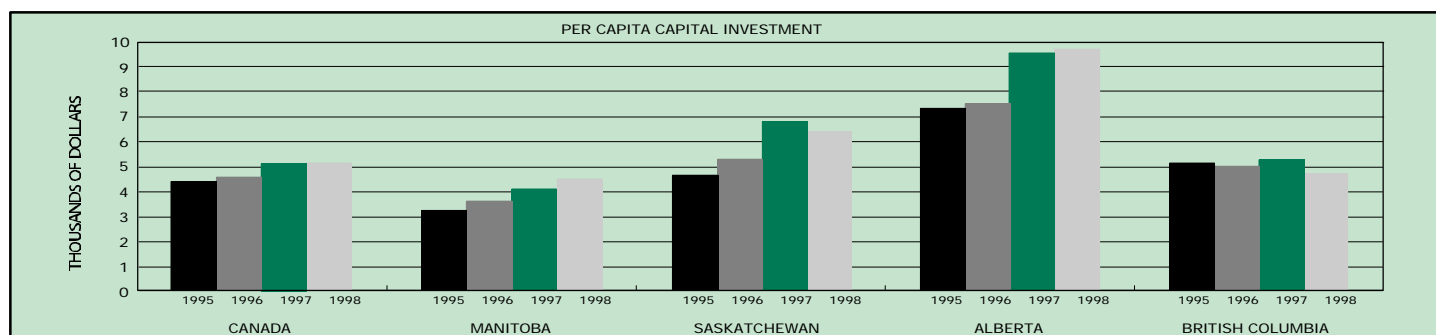

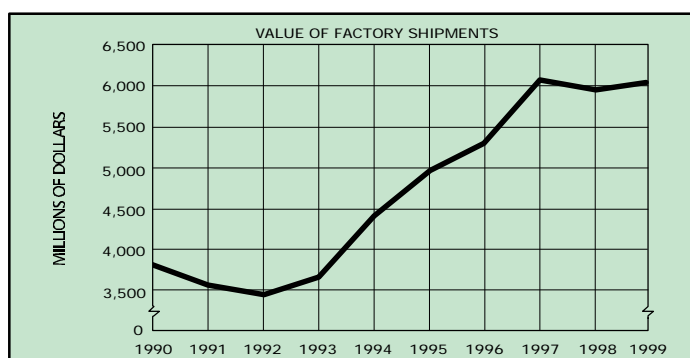

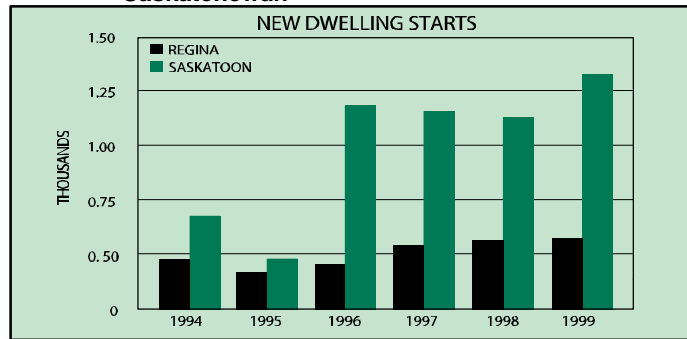

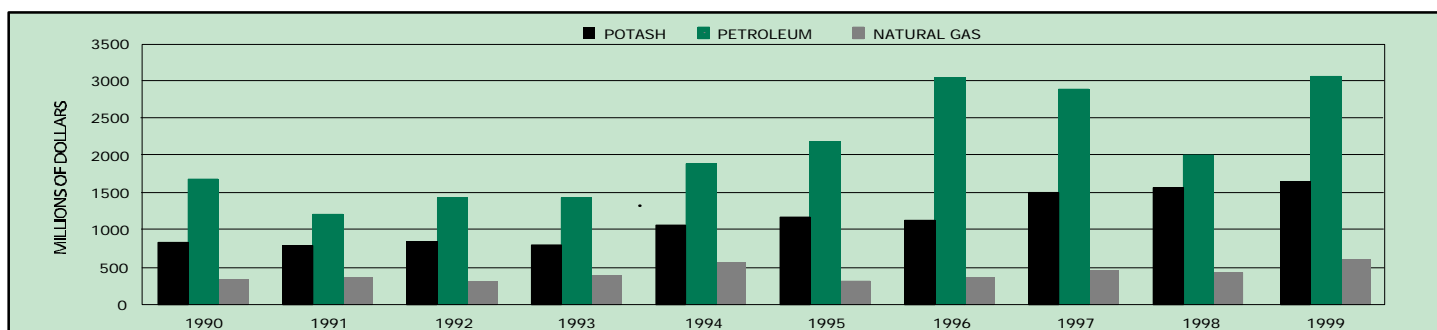

Table 27: Value of Mineral Sales by Kind, Saskatchewan



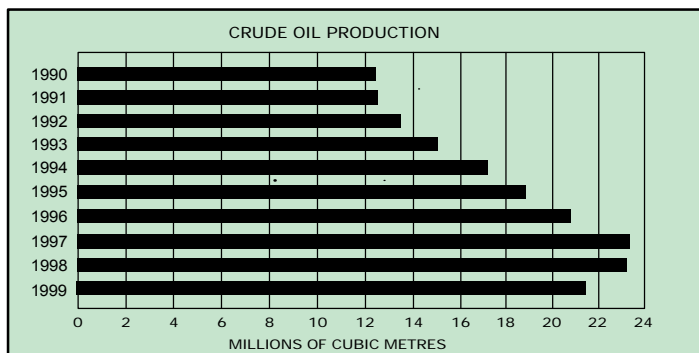

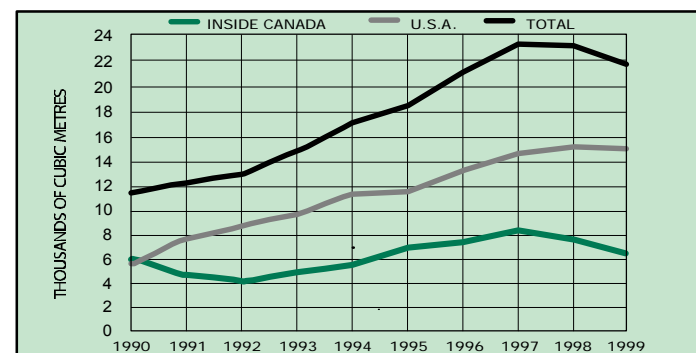

Table 29: Principal Markets for Saskatchewan Crude Oil



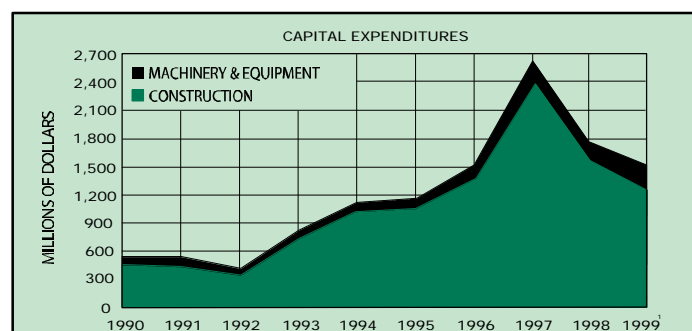

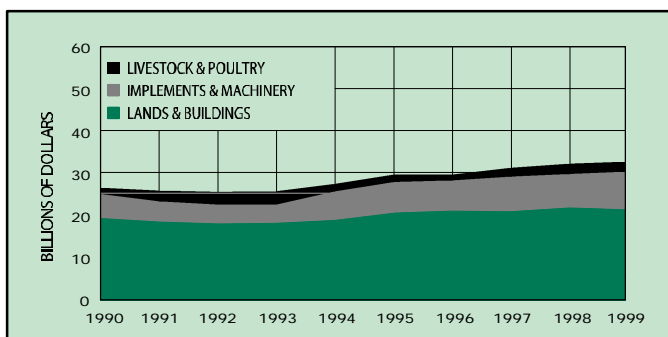

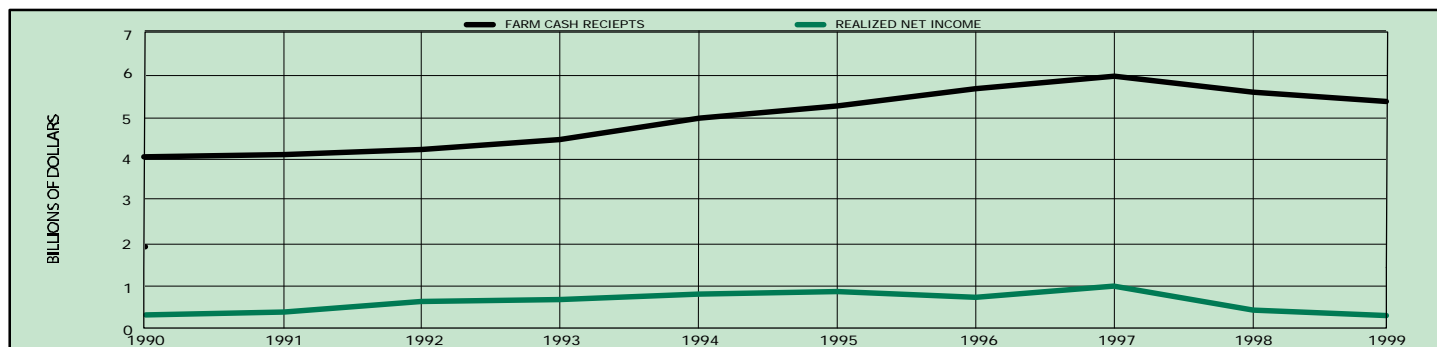

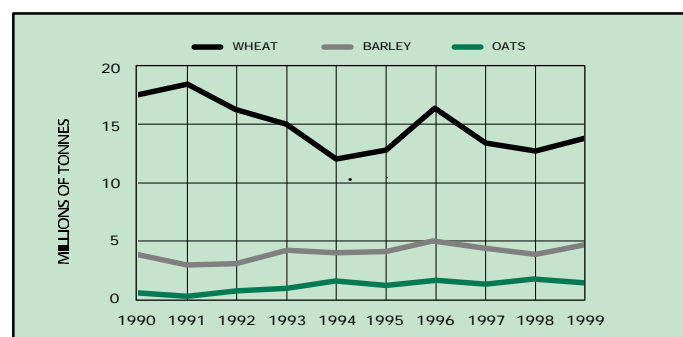
Table 38: Acreage Sown to Wheat by Crop District, Saskatchewan

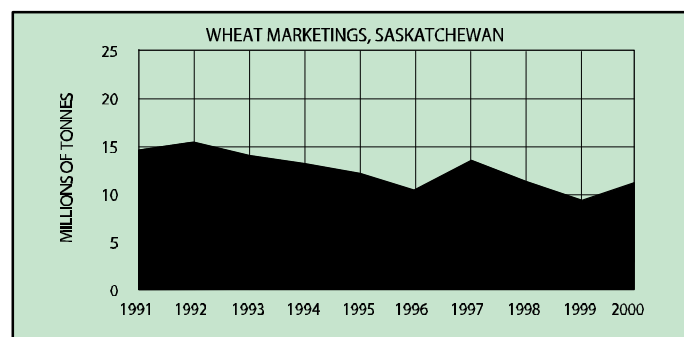

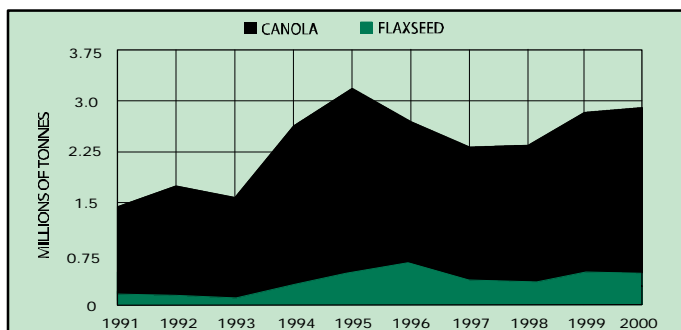
Table 47: Saskatchewan Grain Exports by Destination

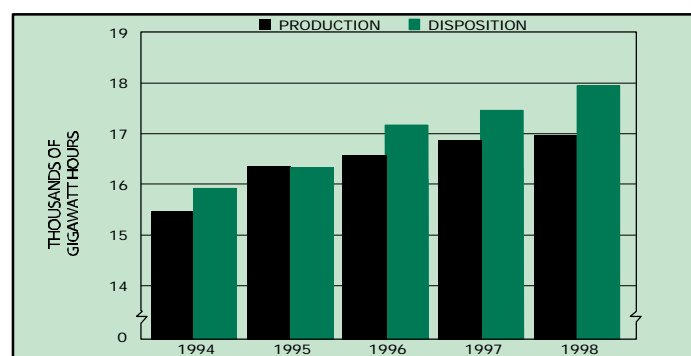

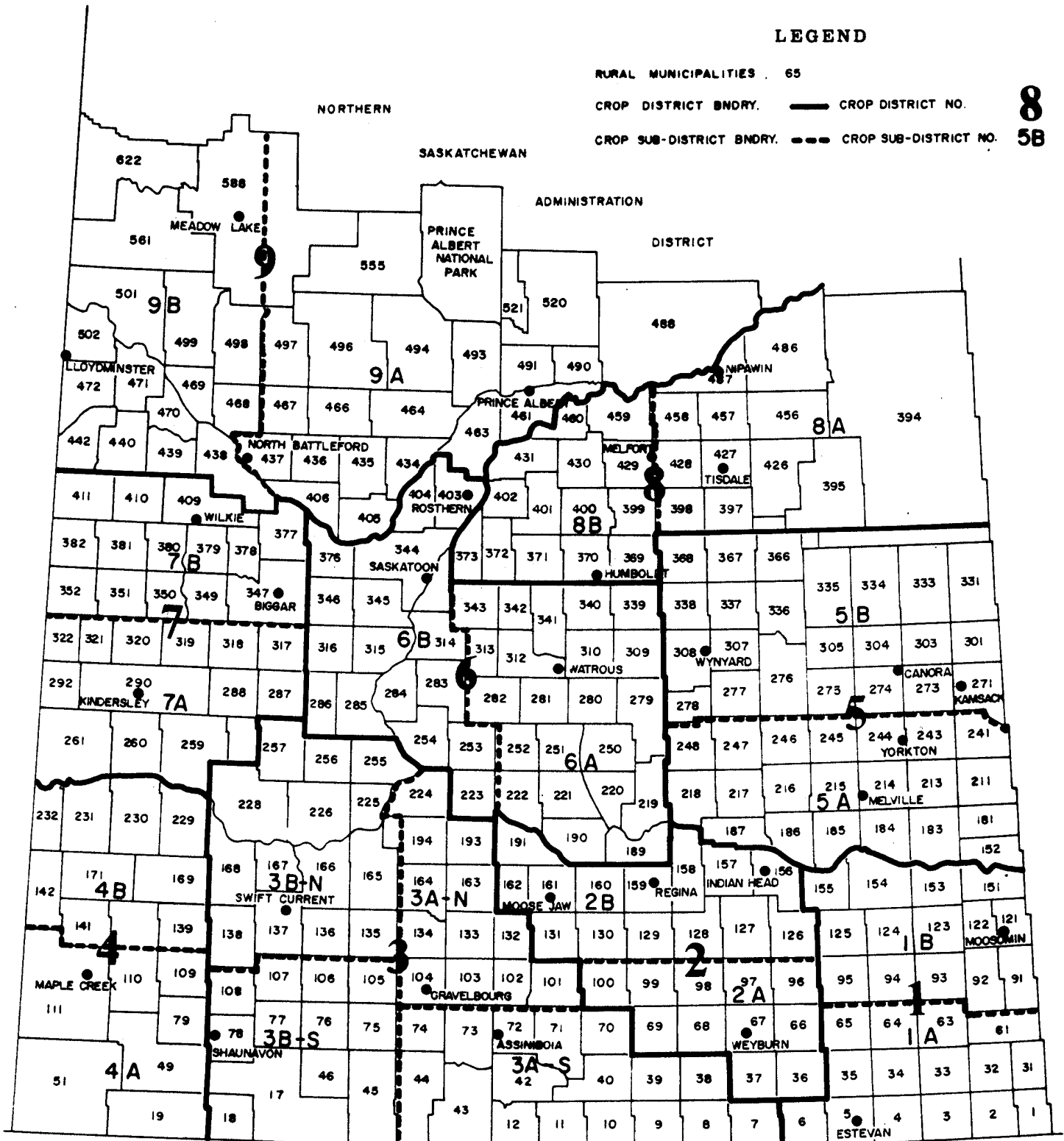

SASKATCHEWAN BY CENSUS DIVISION

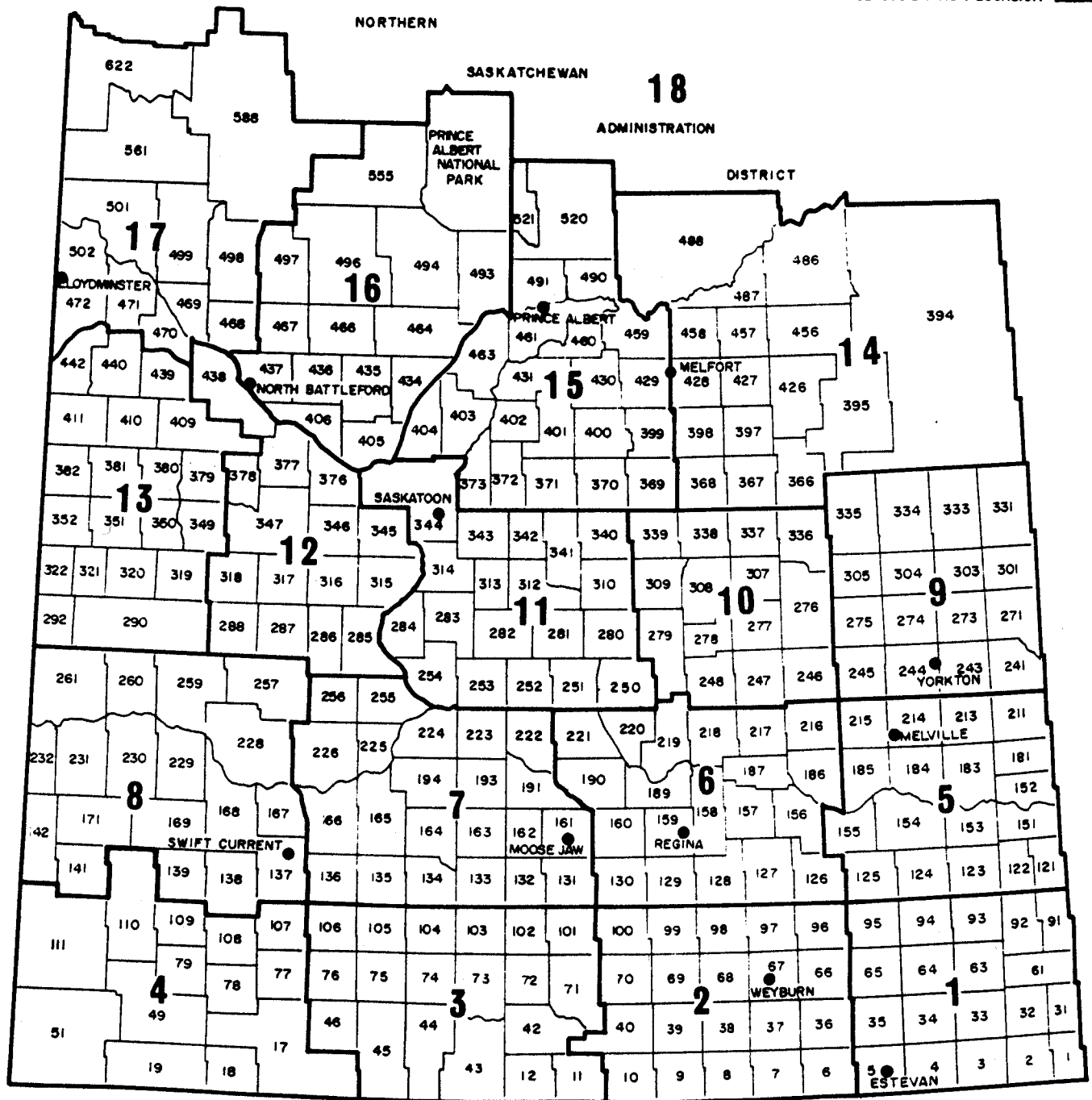

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has developed a set of economic accounts which can be used to trace the development and growth of the Saskatchewan economy.

The purpose of the accounts is to measure the value of economic activity in each sector of the economy. This is done by means of a balancing set of accounts similar to the annual income and expenditure statements of a commercial enterprise.

The accounts have many useful functions. They consolidate information which is now provided through a number of scattered sources and organize it into a central framework. This allows many kinds of economic analysis to be performed ranging from monitoring current economic performance to analysis of structural change in the economy.

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has available upon request, many more detailed tables and other information concerning the Saskatchewan Economic Accounts.

Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

Saskatchewan Gross Domestic Product (GDP) measures the total value of goods and services produced annually in the province. By removing the effects of inflation, it is possible to measure the volume of output. After adjusting for price changes, Saskatchewan's real Gross Domestic Product increased by 1.7 per cent in 1999.

In nominal terms, Saskatchewan's GDP increased by 5.1 per cent in 1999 to \$30,014 million. Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services rose by 3.1 per cent as consumers increased spending in most categories. Government current expenditure on goods and services rose by 2.4 per cent in 1999.

Total investment increased 5.3 per cent over 1998. This increase can be attributed to increases in investment in a variety of industries. Transportation increased 39.7 per cent, investment in institutions increased 37.2 per cent and retail and wholesale trade investment increased 17.2 per cent. Similarly, investment in finance and insurance and communications rose 14.2 and 6.2 per cent respectively.

The value of physical change in inventories was positive in 1999 as inventories of both crops and manufactured goods increased.

Nominal exports increased by 6.3 per cent over 1998 levels. The overall increase followed from increases in crude oil, potash and manufactured goods exports. Nominal imports rose 4.5 per cent in 1999. Increases in imports of goods and services from abroad contributed to the increase.

Real personal expenditure on consumer goods and services increased by 1.9 per cent, government expenditures on goods and services increased by 1.0 per cent and real gross fixed capital formation increased by 5.0 per cent. These increases contributed to final domestic demand for goods and services by individuals, the government and for investment purposes raising by 2.4 per cent over 1998 levels.

This document represents an update to the Saskatchewan economic accounts, released in June 2000. Periodic revisions are common to all economic series to improve the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data.
