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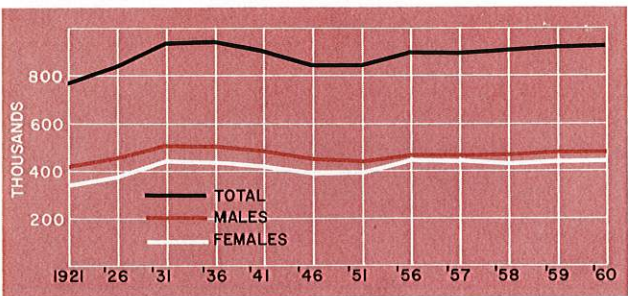
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Editor's Note: In addition to current statistics this issue contains extensive revisions of data published in previous issues of the Saskatchewan Economic Review.

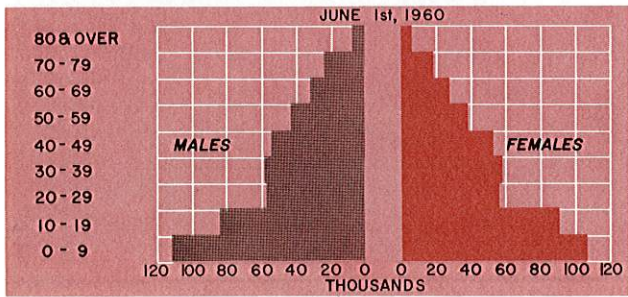

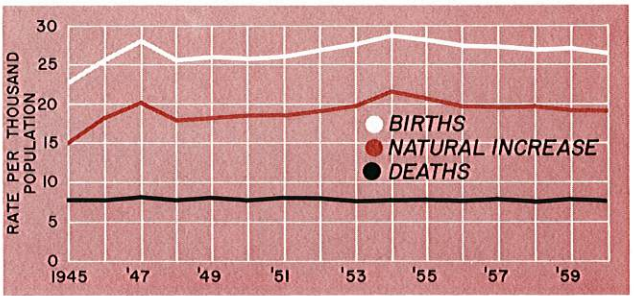
Table 3: POPULATION, Saskatchewan.

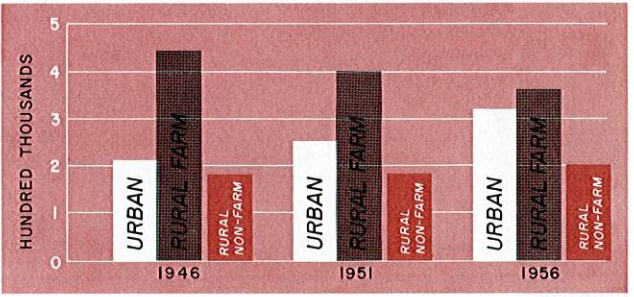

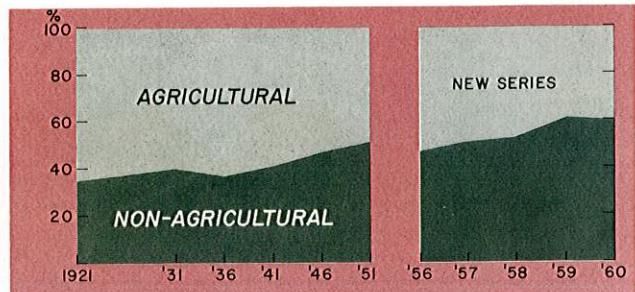

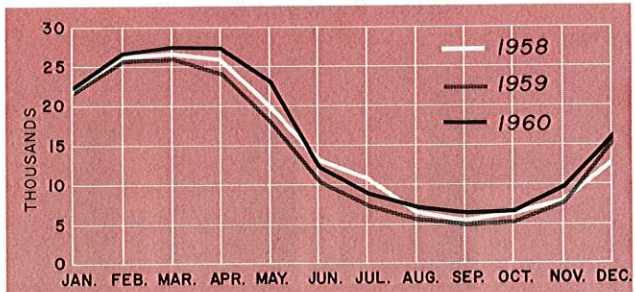

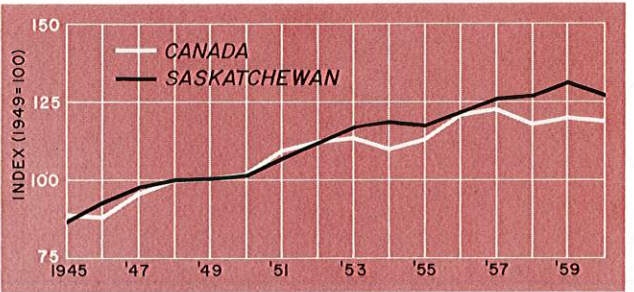

Composite*, Canada, Man., Sask. & Alta. (1949=100)

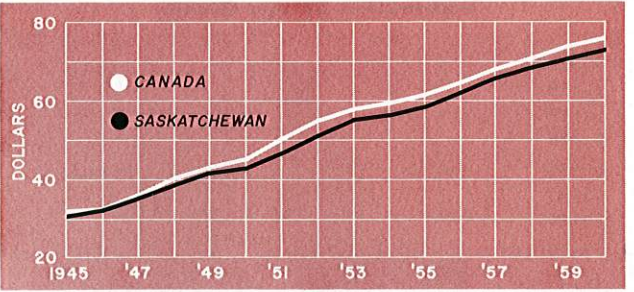

Industrial Composite*, Canada and the Prairie Provinces

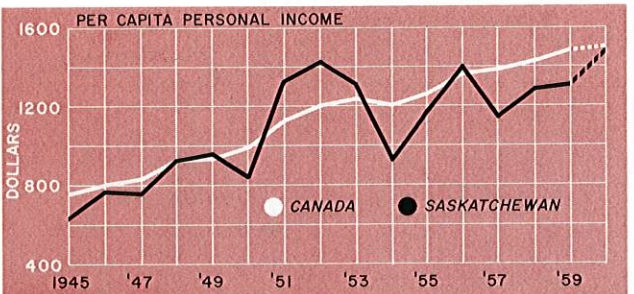

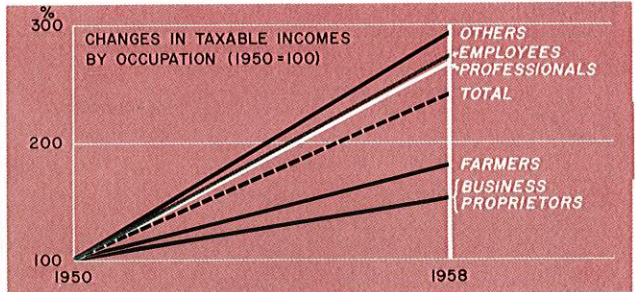

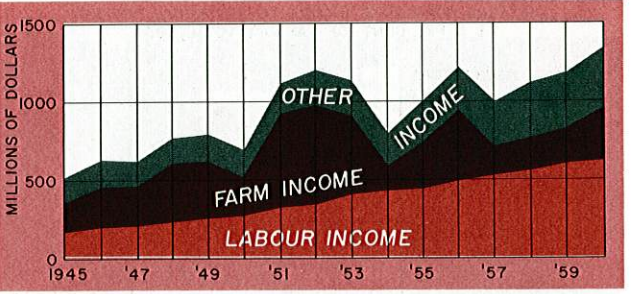

Distribution by Components (\$000,000)

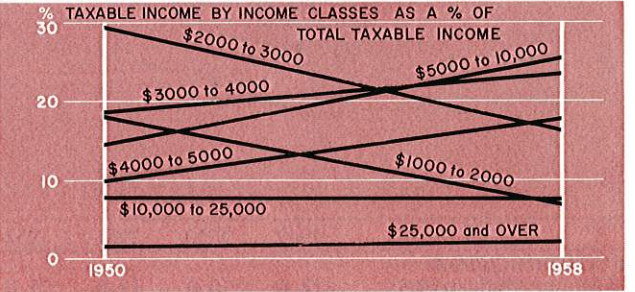

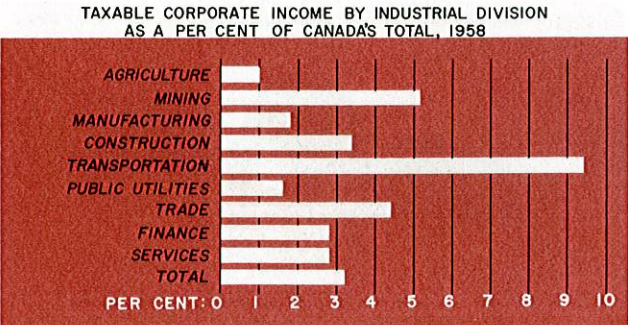

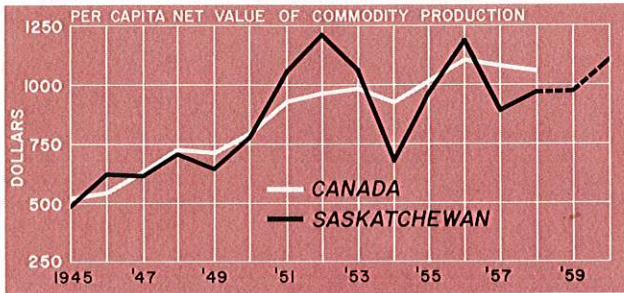

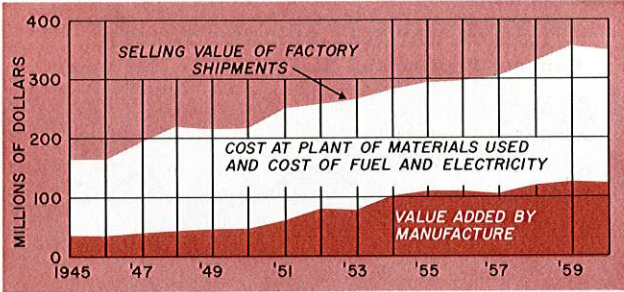

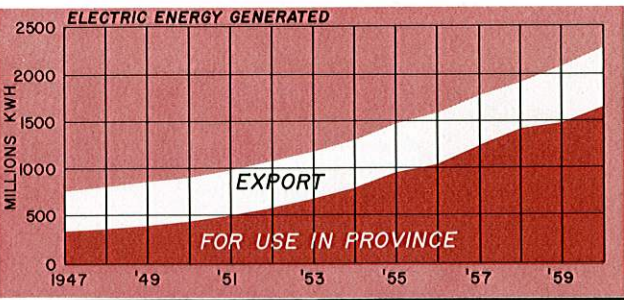

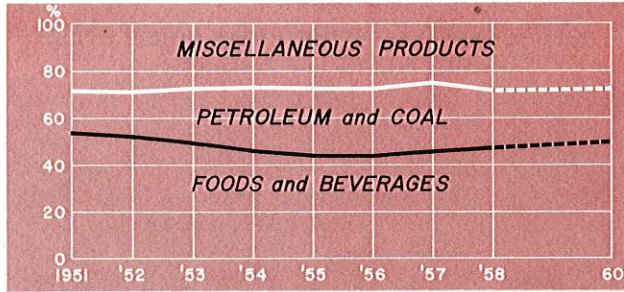

Table 23: RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC, Canada, Prairies and Saskatchewan (000 tons)



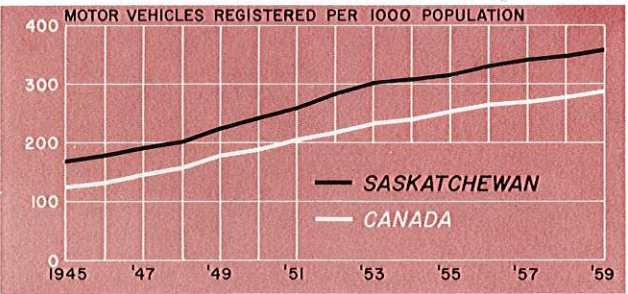
