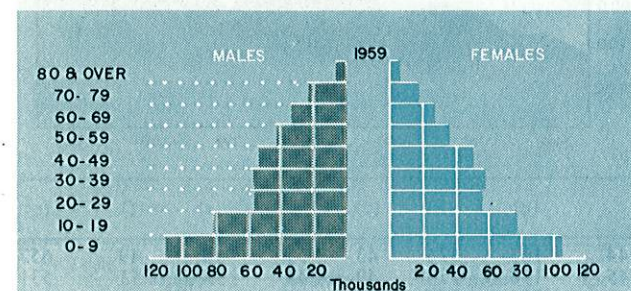

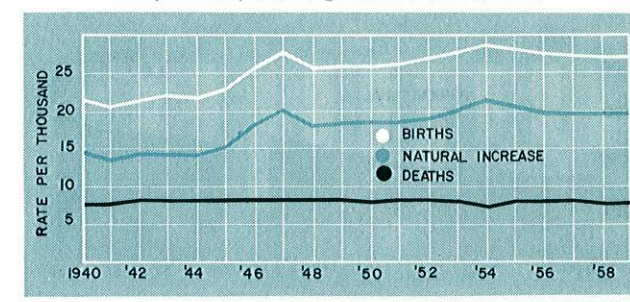

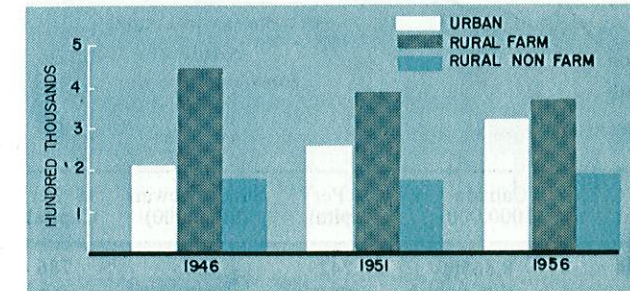

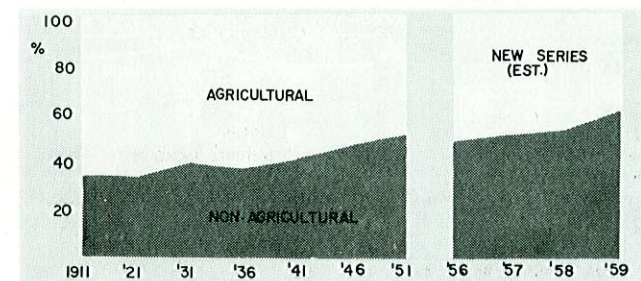

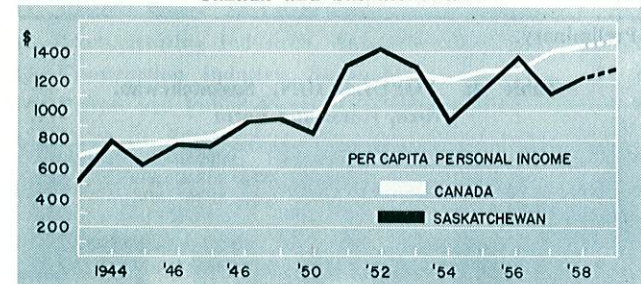

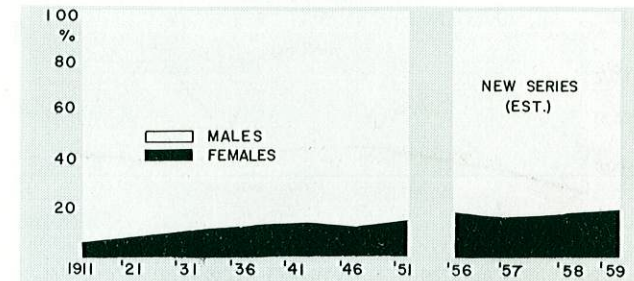

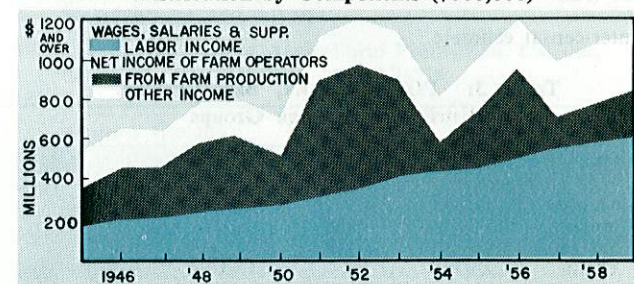
Table 6: LABOR FORCE, Saskatchewan, Distribution by Sex (000's)

Table 8: PERSONAL INCOME, Saskatchewan Distribution by Components (\$000,000)

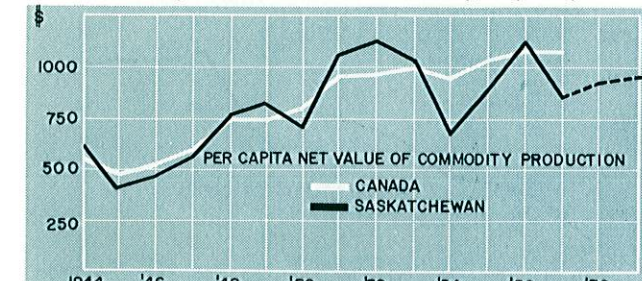

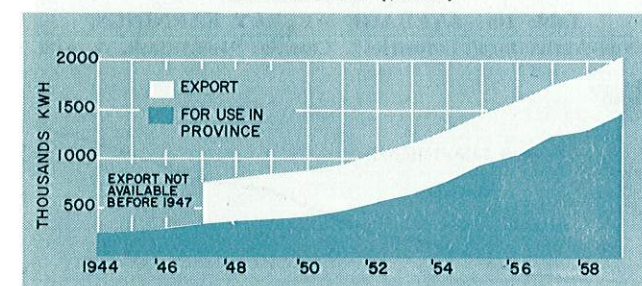

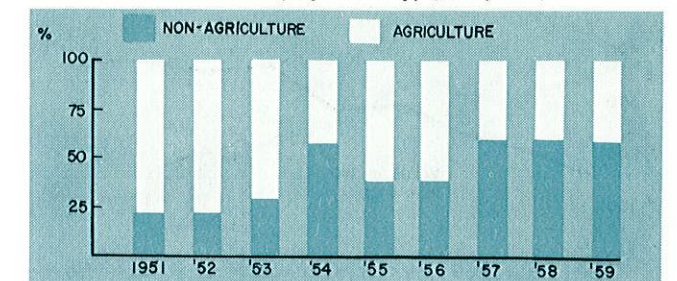

Table 10: NET VALUE OF COMMODITY PRODUCTION Saskatchewan, by Industry, (\$000,000's)

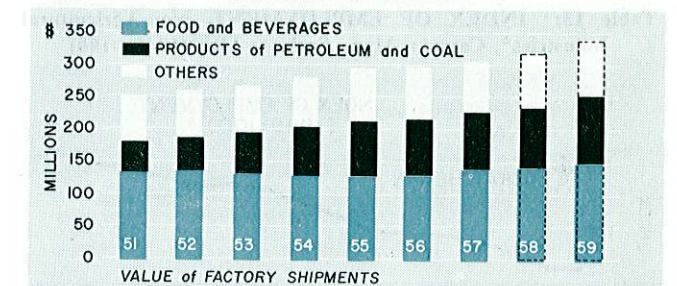

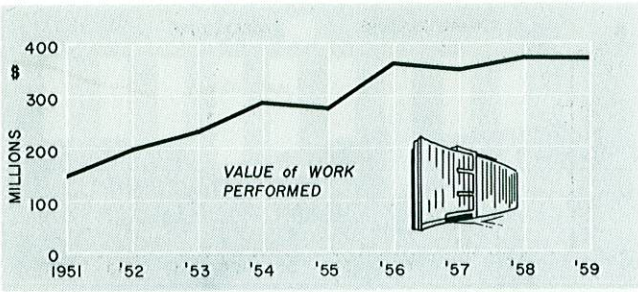

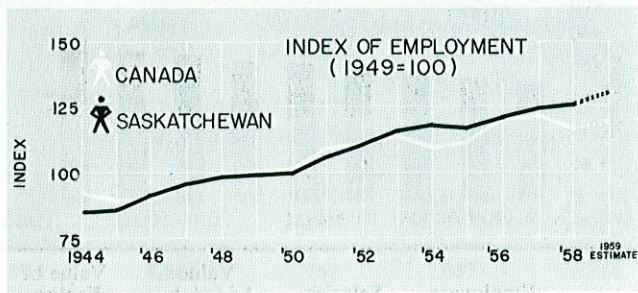

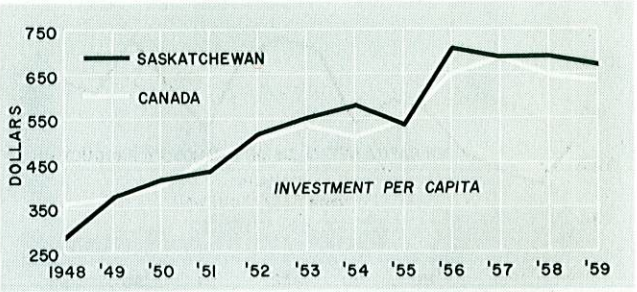

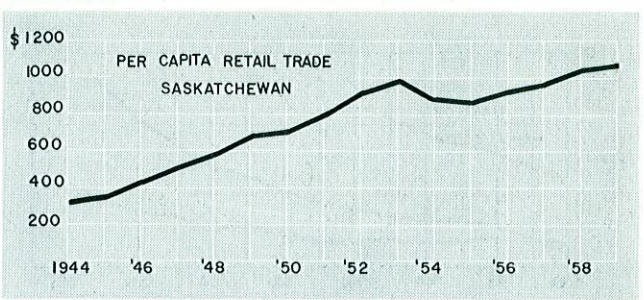

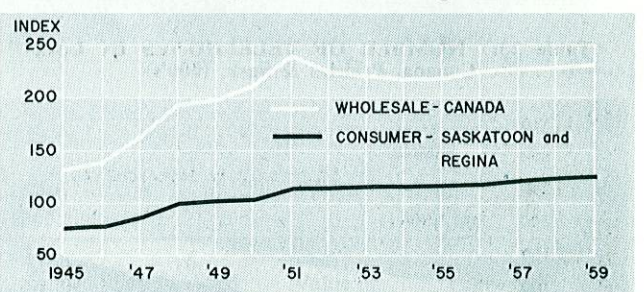

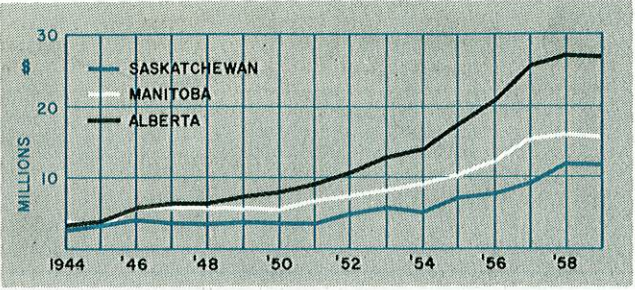

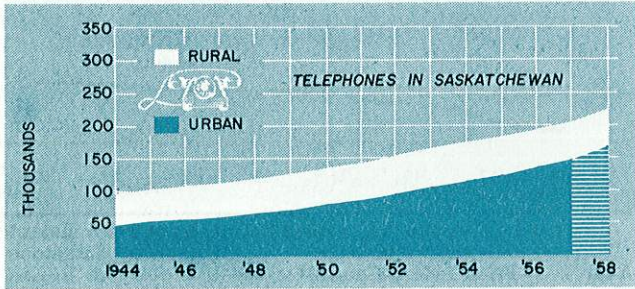

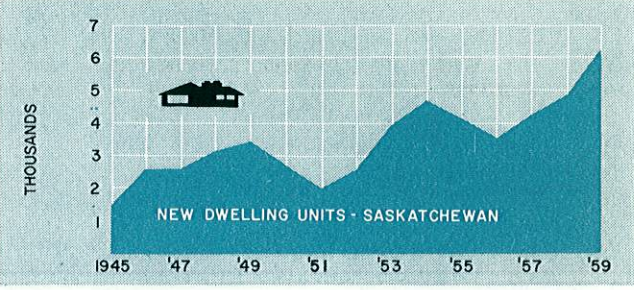

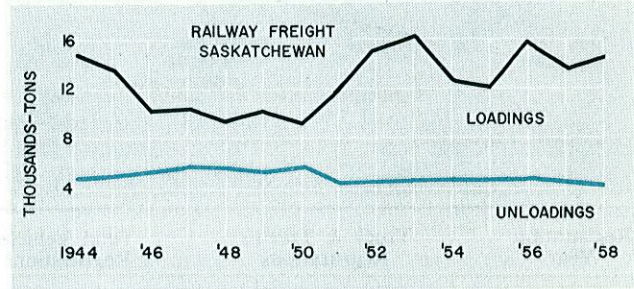

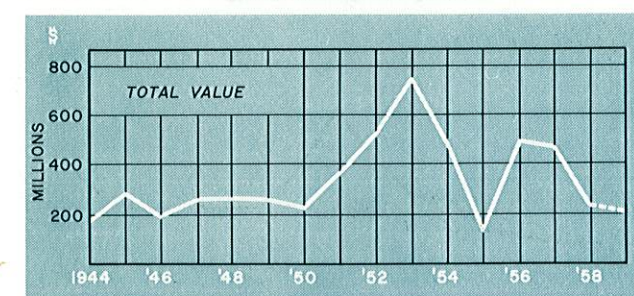

Table 48: COMMERCIAL FISH PRODUCTION, Saskatchewan

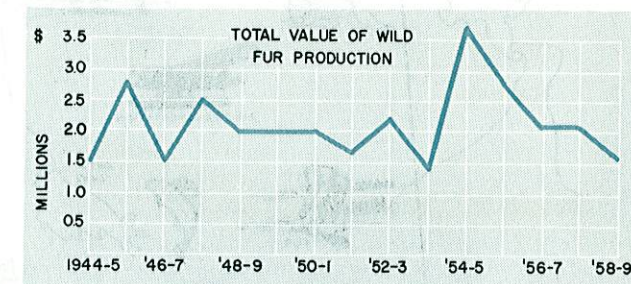
