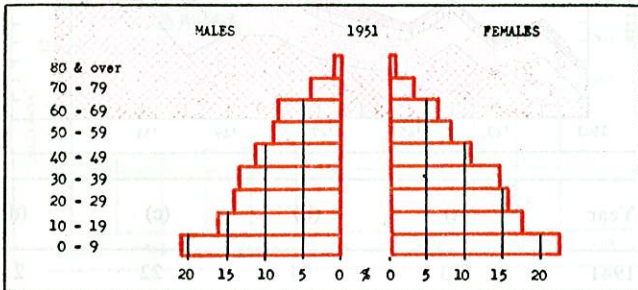

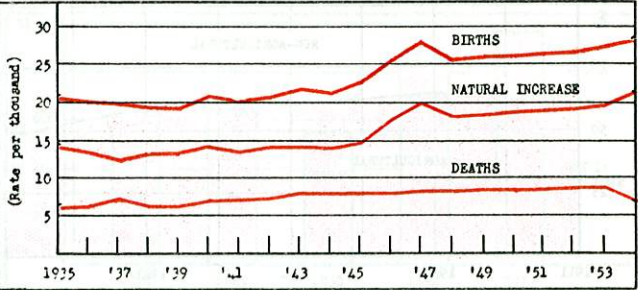

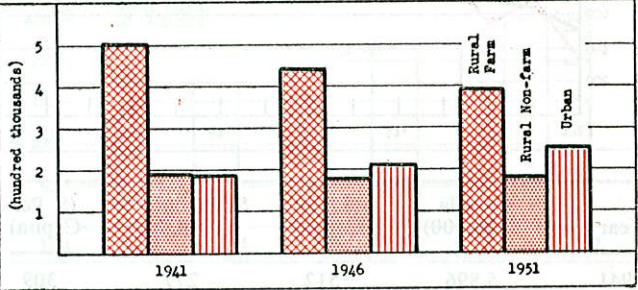

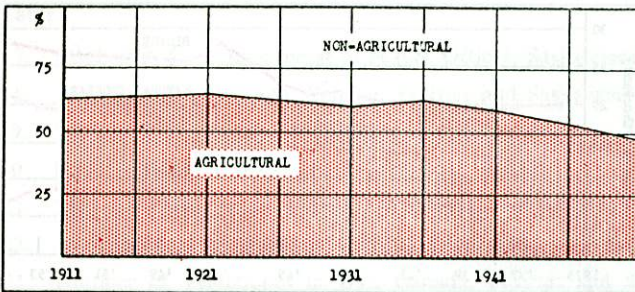

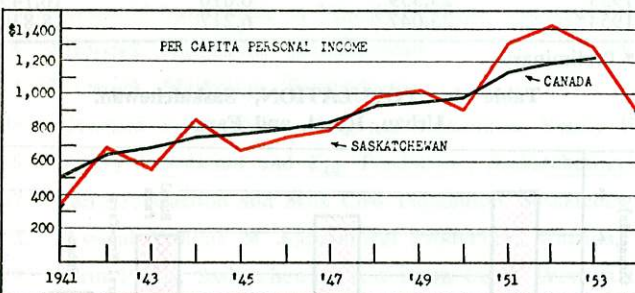
NOTE: In the 1951 Census the definition of urban and rural population was altered. In 1941 the population residing within the boundaries of all incorporated cities, towns and villages was classified as urban, the remainder as rural. Thus some incorporated villages with populations under 100 were classed as urban, while some unincorporated cities and towns were classed as rural. In 1951 the population in cities, towns and villages of 1,000 and over, whether incorporated or unincorporated, as well as the population of all parts of census metropolitan areas were classified as urban. Comparisons given above are based on the 1951 definition.

Table 7: PERSONAL INCOME, Canada and Saskatchewan



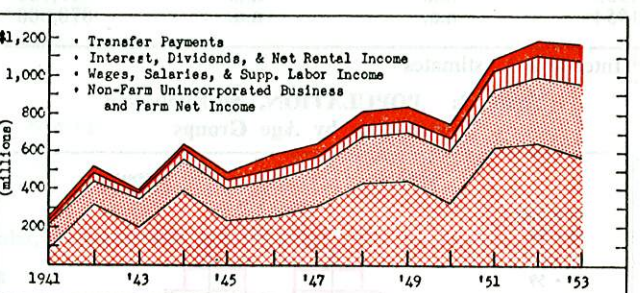

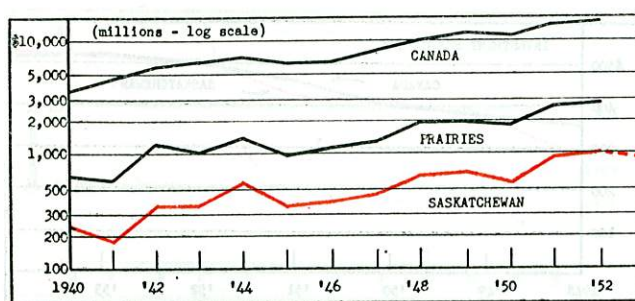

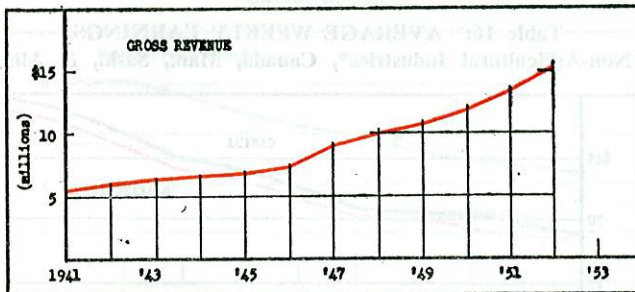

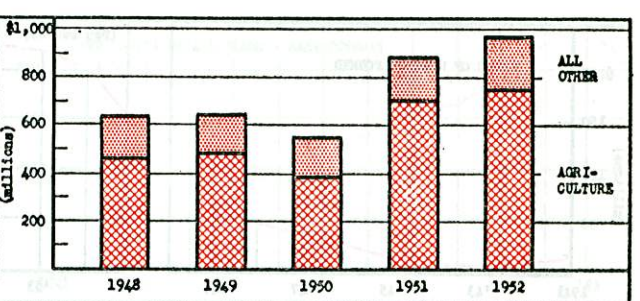

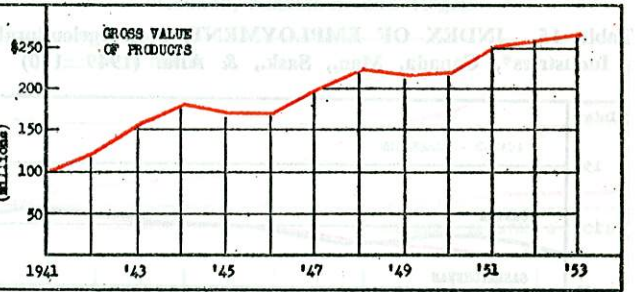

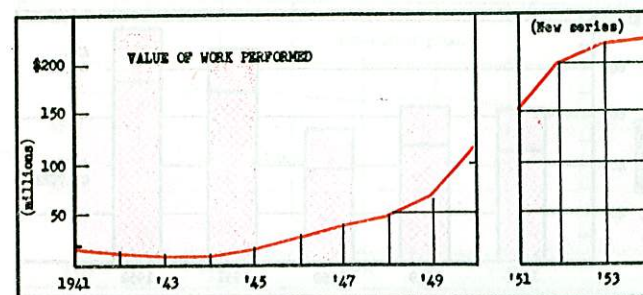

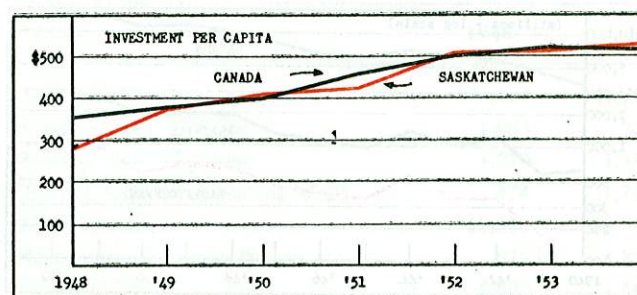

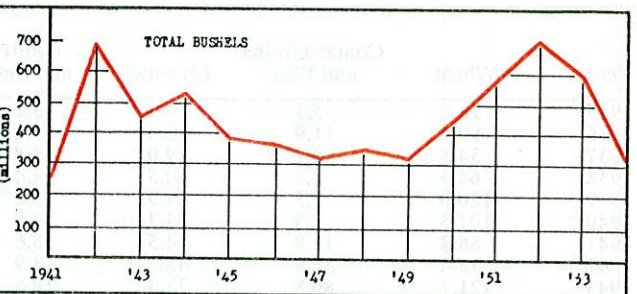

Table 27: ACREAGE OF PRINCIPAL FIELD CROPS, Saskatchewan (000 acres)



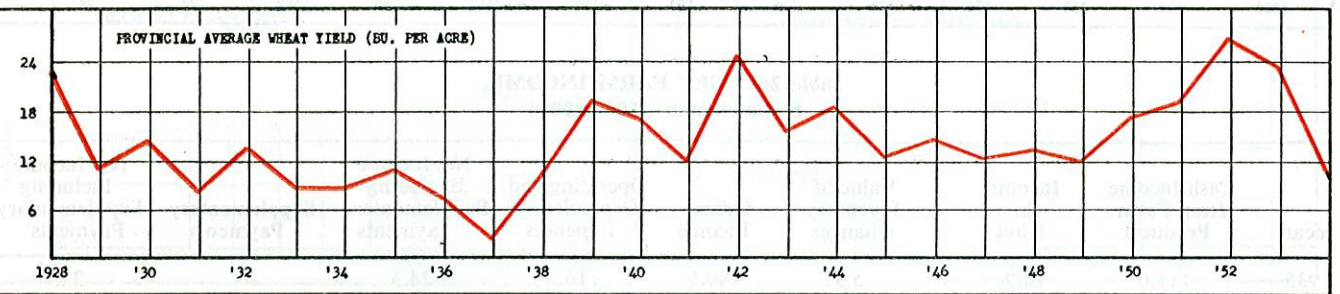

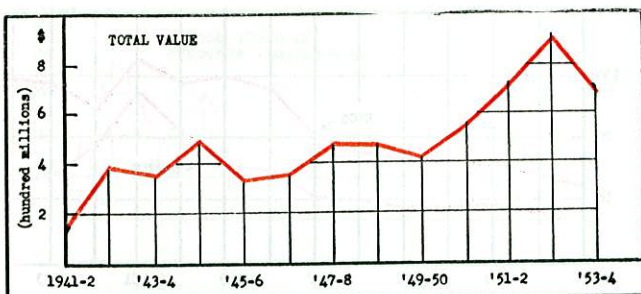

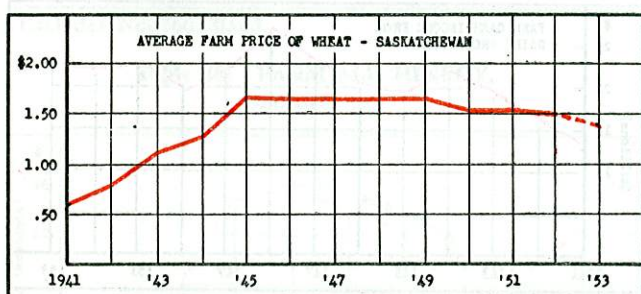

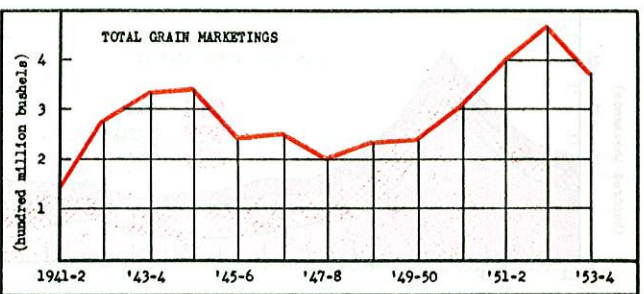

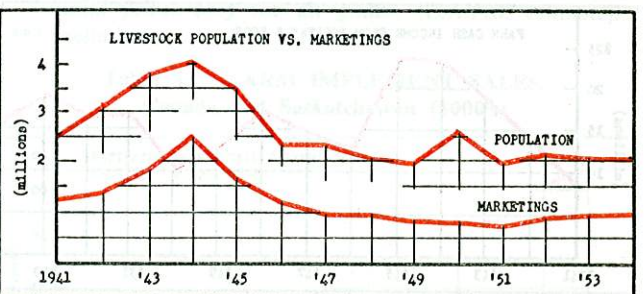
