
Introduction

The economic fortunes of Saskatchewan are heavily influenced by the state of the global economy, commodity prices and the weather. All three of these have impacted Saskatchewan in 2013.

Global economic growth

The United States, Saskatchewan's largest trading partner, grew by 1.9 per cent in 2013, inline with its average in the last twelve years. Canada's economy grew by 2.0 per cent in 2013, slower than its 12-year average of 2.2 per cent.

China and the Eurozone, two important markets for Saskatchewan, had vastly different fortunes. The Eurozone contracted 0.4 per cent as the region remained in recession and significantly underperformed its 12-year average of 1.3 per cent growth. China grew by 7.7 per cent, slower than its 12-year average of 9.3 per cent, but remaining one of the fastest growing economies in the world.

In 2013, the global economy grew by 3.0 per cent, below the 12-year average of 3.7 per cent.

Saskatchewan's economy grew by 4.8 per cent, significantly outperforming the global economy and Saskatchewan's 12-year average of 2.1 per cent.

Oil & natural gas

The price for WTI crude oil averaged US\$97.98/barrel in 2013, about the same as it has been for the past two years.

In 2013, a total of 3,376 oil and natural gas wells were drilled to a total cumulative depth of 5,800 kilometers.

In 2013, Saskatchewan produced 28.3 million cubic metres of oil, about a 10 per cent increase in the amount of oil produced in the last 10 years. An increasing share of the production was light crude.

Potash

The average price of a tonne of potash in 2013 was \$582.68/tonne, down from \$721.30/tonne in 2012. Potash production in 2013 was 9.626 million tonnes, up from 8.280 million tonnes in 2012. Potash is Saskatchewan's second-largest mineral export with \$5.6 billion in sales in 2013, down from \$6.0 billion in 2012.

Saskatchewan sells the majority of its potash to the United States, but Brazil, Indonesia and China are becoming increasingly important markets.


Uranium

Saskatchewan has historically been the world's largest uranium producer, but was surpassed by Kazakhstan in 2009. However, Saskatchewan continues to be a major player in the global uranium market and uranium mining continues to be a significant component of the provincial economy. Uranium is Saskatchewan's third largest mineral export after oil and potash. However, because of the limited number of producers operating in the province, values and quantities of production are kept confidential.

Agriculture

Saskatchewan farmers had an unprecedented year in 2013. Wheat yields across the province averaged 47.9 bushels per acre, exceeding the previous record of 38.6 bushels per acre set in 2011. Record yields were also had in canola, barley, oats, peas, lentils and flax.

Farmers produced a record-breaking 8,917,600 tonnes of canola in 2013, breaking the record of 7,384,200 tonnes in 2011. Total production across all crop types totaled 38,709,500 tonnes, breaking the record of 30,376,200 tonnes in 2009. This is despite a long-term downward trend in total land use which peaked in 1994 at 19,567,500 hectares and declined to 17,292,400 hectares in 2013.




Net farm cash income from operations hit an all-time high of \$4.063 billion in 2013, surpassing the previous record of \$3.823 billion in 2011. Canola was the primary driver of the record-setting year by having both record-high average prices of \$603/tonne and record production.

Employment & income

Saskatchewan added 18,200 new jobs in 2013. Of these new jobs, 14,100 were full-time jobs. Unemployment in Saskatchewan averaged 4.0 per cent in 2013, 0.7 percentage points lower than the 2012 average of 4.7 per cent.

Average weekly earnings in Saskatchewan went up 4.1 per cent in 2013, and in the past five years have increased 18.3 per cent.

In 2013, the mining, quarrying, oil and gas sector continued to offer the highest average hourly wages in the province at \$43.63/hour.




Investment

New capital investment in 2013 was \$21.345 billion, second only to the record-setting year of 2012 with \$21.613 billion. Investment was led by the mining, oil and gas industry at \$7.737 billion, followed by housing at \$3.791 billion.

Population

There were 15,131 births in Saskatchewan in 2013 and 9,551 deaths resulting in a natural population increase of 5,580. Additionally, in 2013, there were 14,476 more people that moved to Saskatchewan than left, of which 13,108 were from other countries and 1,368 were from other provinces. Combined natural increase and net immigration have resulted in a total population increase of 20,056 over the year. At the end of 2013, the population of Saskatchewan reached an estimated record high of 1,117,503.



Housing

In 2013, there were 8,290 housing starts, down from 9,968 in 2012, but still up over 800 per cent from the lows of 1991.

Retail trade

Retail trade hit an all-time record high of \$18.301 billion in 2013, an increase of \$895 million over the record-setting year of 2012.

Utilities

Rapid economic growth has been driving increases in Saskatchewan's electricity consumption. Saskatchewan consumed 23,155 GWh in 2013, a new record, surpassing the previous record set in 2012 of 22,129 GWh.

Most of the increase in electricity demand was met by increasing use of natural gas turbines. Natural gas powered supply increased from 4,968 GWh in 2012 to 6,460 GWh in 2013.

Coal as a power source peaked in 2009 at 12,317 GWh and has since fallen to 10,846 GWh.

Conclusion

The Saskatchewan economy had a very good year in 2013, led by record oil and crop production. Employment grew by 18,200 while the unemployment rate remained very low. Population grew by 20,056 persons, reflecting the addition of 14,476 new immigrants and a natural growth of 5,580 persons.




































































