

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

May 2016

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering May 15th to 21st, 2016, there were 577,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is an increase of 17,700 from April 2016 but 4,900 less than the number employed in May 2015.

Agricultural employment was 43,900 persons in May 2016, up 4,100 from the April 2016 level and 1,000 more than the May 2015 agricultural employment level of 42,900. Non-agricultural employment was 533,900 persons in May 2016. This is an increase of 13,600 from the April 2016 non-agriculture employment level of 520,300 but 5,900 less than May 2015.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for May 2016 was 5.8 percent. This is a decrease of 1.2 percentage points from the April 2016 rate of 7.0 percent but 0.5 percentage points higher than the May 2015 level of 5.3 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 11,000 to 613,500 persons in May 2016 from 602,500 persons in April 2016. This is 1,800 less than the May 2015 labour force of 615,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 1.2 percentage points to 70.7 percent in May 2016 from 69.5 percent in April 2016. The May 2015 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.5 percent.

There were 35,800 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during May 2016. This is a decrease of 6,600 from April 2016 but is 3,200 more than the number unemployed in May 2015.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 568,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan in May 2016, up 2,200 from the April 2016 level of 566,700 but down 6,400 from the May 2015 employment level of 575,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2016 was 6.0 percent. This is a decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the April 2016 rate of 6.3 percent but 1.0 percentage points higher than the May 2015 rate of 5.0 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 434,500 persons in May 2016 to 18,258,700 persons from 17,824,200 persons in April 2016. In May 2015, there were 18,110,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.6 percentage points in May 2016 to 6.9 percent from the April 2016 level of 7.5 percent. In May 2015, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.1 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.9 percent in May 2016. This is 0.2 percentage points lower than April 2016 but 0.1 percentage points higher than the May 2015 level of 6.8 percent.
