

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

April 2013

## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended April 20, 2013, there were 548,500 persons employed in Saskatchewan during April 2013, an increase of 800 from March 2013 and 16,700 more than the number employed in April 2012.

Agricultural employment was 40,000 persons in April 2013, down 1,500 from the March 2013 level but 2,800 more than the April 2012 agricultural employment level of 37,200. Non-agricultural employment was 508,500 persons in April 2013. This is an increase of 2,300 from the March 2013 non-agriculture employment level of 506,200 and 13,900 more than April 2012.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for April 2013 was 4.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points from the March 2013 rate of 4.0 percent but 1.0 percentage points lower than the April 2012 level of 5.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 3,100 to 573,600 persons in April 2013 from 570,500 persons in March 2013. This is 11,700 more than the April 2012 labour force of 561,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.3 percentage points to 69.8 percent in April 2013 from 69.5 percent in March 2013. The April 2012 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.6 percent.

There were 25,100 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during April 2013. This is an increase of 2,300 from March 2013 but is 5,000 less than the number unemployed in April 2012.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 553,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan in April 2013, down 1,500 from the March 2013 level of 554,700 but up 16,400 from the April 2012 employment level of 536,800 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for April 2013 was 4.0 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the March 2013 rate of 3.9 percent but 0.9 percentage points lower than the April 2012 rate of 4.9 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 141,800 persons in April 2013 to 17,490,100 persons from 17,348,300 persons in March 2013. In April 2012, there were 17,338,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.3 percentage points in April 2013 to 7.4 percent from the March 2013 level of 7.7 percent. In April 2012, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.5 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in April 2013. This is unchanged from March 2013 and 0.1 percentage points lower than the April 2012 level of 7.3 percent.
