

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

July 2013

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended July 20, 2013, there were 564,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan during July 2013, a decrease of 4,100 from June 2013 but 21,500 more than the number employed in July 2012.

Agricultural employment was 43,400 persons in July 2013, down 1,100 from the June 2013 level but 3,200 more than the July 2012 agricultural employment level of 40,200. Non-agricultural employment was 520,700 persons in July 2013. This is a decrease of 3,000 from the June 2013 non-agriculture employment level of 523,700 but 18,300 more than July 2012.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for July 2013 was 4.5 percent. This is an increase of 1.2 percentage points from the June 2013 rate of 3.3 percent but 0.9 percentage points lower than the July 2012 level of 5.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 2,800 to 590,500 persons in July 2013 from 587,700 persons in June 2013. This is 17,000 more than the July 2012 labour force of 573,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.2 percentage points to 71.4 percent in July 2013 from 71.2 percent in June 2013. The July 2012 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.6 percent.

There were 26,500 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during July 2013. This is an increase of 6,900 from June 2013 but is 4,500 less than the number unemployed in July 2012.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 559,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in July 2013, up 3,000 from the June 2013 level of 556,300 and is up 21,200 from the July 2012 employment level of 538,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for July 2013 was 4.0 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the June 2013 rate of 3.7 percent but 0.9 percentage points lower than the July 2012 rate of 4.9 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 103,900 persons in July 2013 to 18,002,700 persons from 18,106,600 persons in June 2013. In July 2012, there were 17,777,200 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.8 percentage points in July 2013 to 7.4 percent from the June 2013 level of 6.6 percent. In July 2012, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.5 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in July 2013. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than June 2013 but 0.1 percentage points lower than the July 2012 level of 7.3 percent.
