## Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

December 2013

### **UNADJUSTED DATA**

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended December 14, 2013, there were 553,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan during December 2013, an increase of 1,400 from November 2013 and 13,900 more than the number employed in December 2012.

Agricultural employment was 42,100 persons in December 2013, down 100 from the November 2013 level but 1,900 more than the December 2012 agricultural employment level of 40,200. Non-agricultural employment was 511,600 persons in December 2013. This is an increase of 1,500 from the November 2013 non-agriculture employment level of 510,100 and 12,000 more than December 2012.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for December 2013 was 3.5 percent. This is a decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the November 2013 rate of 3.8 percent and 0.8 percentage points lower than the December 2012 level of 4.3 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 400 to 573,900 persons in December 2013 from 574,300 persons in November 2013. This is 9,900 more than the December 2012 labour force of 564,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> fell 0.1 percentage points to 68.8 percent in December 2013 from 68.9 percent in November 2013. The December 2012 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.0 percent.

There were 20,100 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during December 2013. This is a decrease of 1,800 from November 2013 and is 4,100 less than the number unemployed in December 2012.

#### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 558,100 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in December 2013, up 1,900 from the November 2013 level of 556,200 and is up 13,800 from the December 2012 employment level of 544,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>seasonally adjusted</u> <u>unemployment rate</u> for December 2013 was 3.9 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the November 2013 rate of 4.1 percent and 0.7 percentage points lower than the December 2012 rate of 4.6 percent.

## **CANADIAN DATA**

Canadian <u>employment</u> decreased by 118,500 persons in December 2013 to 17,681,500 persons from 17,800,000 persons in November 2013. In December 2012, there were 17,574,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.3 percentage points in December 2013 to 6.7 percent from the November 2013 level of 6.4 percent. In December 2012, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.5 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in December 2013. This is 0.3 percentage points higher than November 2013 and 0.1 percentage points higher than the December 2012 level of 7.1 percent.
