

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

October 2012

## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended October 13, 2012, there were 541,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan during October 2012, an increase of 800 from September 2012 and 12,500 more than the number employed in October 2011.

Agricultural employment was 43,700 persons in October 2012, down 900 from the September 2012 level but 3,800 more than the October 2011 agricultural employment level of 39,900. Non-agricultural employment was 497,900 persons in October 2012. This is an increase of 1,700 from the September 2012 non-agriculture employment level of 496,200 and 8,700 more than October 2011.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for October 2012 was 4.0 percent. This is unchanged from the September 2012 rate but 0.3 percentage points higher than the October 2011 level of 3.7 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 1,100 to 564,500 persons in October 2012 from 563,400 persons in September 2012. This is 14,900 more than the October 2011 labour force of 549,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.1 percentage points to 69.3 percent in October 2012 from 69.2 percent in September 2012. The October 2011 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.5 percent.

There were 22,800 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during October 2012. This is an increase of 200 from September 2012 and is 2,400 more than the number unemployed in October 2011.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 540,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan in October 2012, up 2,300 from the September 2012 level of 538,400 and is up 12,200 from the October 2011 employment level of 528,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for October 2012 was 4.7 percent. This is unchanged from the September 2012 rate but 0.5 percentage points higher than the October 2011 rate of 0.5 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 17,300 persons in October 2012 to 17,627,600 persons from 17,644,900 persons in September 2012. In October 2011, there were 17,402,300 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate for October 2012 was 6.7 percent, unchanged from the September 2012 level. In October 2011, Canada's unemployment rate was also 6.7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.4 percent in October 2012. This is unchanged from September 2012. The October 2011 level was also 7.4 percent.
